FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK....

Dear Friends,

Happy Feast of Pentecost – the birthday of the Church! I have heard some arguing that it is not really the birthday of the Church because neither Paul nor other New Testament writers mention about it except in just one chapter. But a great majority of the mainline churches agree that it is such a seminal event that it truly is the birthday of the Church. No matter what, it was at Pentecost a small body of believers was empowered to be evangelizers as the Holy Spirit filled them. Paul calls the “church” “the body of Christ” and each one “individually members of it” (1 Corinthians 12.27-28). This body of Christ is where “to each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good” (1 Cor. 12.7). It is a group for the effective work of the church, but the gifts for its health and mission of the body are given to the individual members.

Each one of us has the flame of the Holy Spirit. We manifest the presence of the Spirit in various ways we use our gifts for the mission and growth of the body of Christ here at St. John Neumann. Our Annual Auction-dinner-gala this weekend celebrates our united effort to help our parish stay strong financially. The whole parish can rightly take credit for this event - the many who are attending the evening, the many more who are participants in some tangible ways of supporting it and our amazing organizing team.

Our different ministries and vibrant committees are clear and visible signs of the active presence of the Spirit. Among these, the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) is the apex consultative body of the parish with a three-year term for its members. It is our tradition that each year one third of the Council members will retire and an equal number will be replaced through a process of spiritual discernment. This year due to various reasons, we have more positions open and so we are blessed to have more new members joining. As every year, the commissioning of the new Parish pastoral Council will be on Pentecost Sunday, the only difference being that it will be under the tent – reminiscent of the “Tent of Meeting” in Exodus 33:7-11. As I thank the retiring members for their valuable contribution to the good of the parish, I wish the PPC another year of ministry as a consultative body that evaluates the pastoral life of the parish in light of its mission and recommends pastoral initiatives for the full participation of the whole parish in the life of the community, as envisaged in the Second Vatican Council’s (Decree on the Bishop’s Pastoral Office in the Church, no.27). Please congratulate and get to know them so that you can communicate to them the needs and concerns of the Parish. May we all be filled with the gifts of the Holy Spirit on this Pentecost!

OBSERVE PENTECOST EVERYDAY!

"It will always be Pentecost in the church," affirmed Oscar Romero, Archbishop of El Salvador, on Pentecost Sunday 1978, "provided the Church lets the beauty of the Holy Spirit shine forth from her countenance. When the Church ceases to let her strength rest on the Power from above which Christ promised her and which he gave her on that day, and when the Church leans rather on the weak forces of the power or wealth of this earth, then the Church ceases to be newsworthy. The Church will be fair to see, perennially young, attractive in every age, as long as she is faithful to the Spirit that floods her and she reflects that Spirit through her communities, through her pastors, through her very life" (*The Violence of Love*, The Plough Pub. Co., Farmington, PA: 1998).

Archbishop Romero's declaration reminds us -- as does today's Gospel -- that Pentecost is not just one day, but every day. Without breath, there is no life. Without the Spirit, the Church is a field of dry, dead bones. Fulton J. Sheen once said about the Church, "Even though we are God's *chosen people*, we often behave more like God's *frozen people*--frozen in our prayer life, frozen in the way we relate with one another, frozen in the way we celebrate our faith." Today is a great day to ask the Holy Spirit to rekindle in us the spirit of new life and enthusiasm, the fire of God's love. Let us repeat Cardinal Newman's favorite little prayer, "Come Holy Spirit:"

PENTECOST: GOSPEL BOMBS!

Some time ago now, Joseph Bailey wrote a book called the Gospel Blimp. It's about the attempt of Christian neighbours reaching out to the community for Christ. The family purchased a hot air balloon to broadcast the Gospel to the community and dropped "bombs" on the town (These "bombs" were tracts wrapped in coloured cellophane). In spite of the trouble and expense of this attempt at witnessing to Jesus, it failed miserably. The point the writer was making is that there is no substitute for loving care and personal witness, even though this is slow, time-consuming, likely to cause anxiety and even likely to create some hostility. You have probably heard these sayings, "I'd rather see a sermon than hear one", and "Actions speak louder than words." There is truth in these sayings, but there are still those times when words are necessary, and we must speak. The Gospel, by its very nature, needs to be shared. It isn't something we keep to ourselves, but, by our words and deeds of love, the Gospel speaks to the lives of people about God's love for them and His willingness to reach out and embrace everyone in his time of need. When was the last time you talked with someone outside of your circle of Christian friends about Jesus? When was it that you last attempted to share your Faith with someone or at least invited someone to your Church on a Sunday? Are you aware of the Presence of the Holy Spirit

"DID YOU EVER GET INTO ANY FIGHT?"

A little girl asked her grandfather, "Did you and grandma ever get into any fights?" The grandfather replied: "We don't talk about it very often, but there was a time when we were not getting along very well. We seemed to be picking on each a lot and finding all kinds of things to argue about and really getting on one another's nerves. Well, one day I came in from the garden and I heard a voice upstairs. I went to the stairs and heard your grandmother telling God what she could not bring herself to tell me." "Well, what did you do?" asked the grand-daughter. "I quietly walked up the stairs," he replied, "and knelt down beside her and told God my side of the story. And from that day to this, we have never had a problem which we couldn't resolve by talking it over with each other and with God." *Do you think the Holy Spirit was active in that couples' marriage? There can be no doubt. Conflict will always remain part of every relationship. The fruits of the Spirit – love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, gentleness, faithfulness, and self-control – will always remain critical for happy relationships with others.*

DO YOU KNOW THE "FATIMA SECRETS"?

In 1917, as World War I was being fought, Our Lady appeared to three children as they shepherded their parents' sheep near what is now the Fatima grotto. The children, Jacinta and Francisco Marto, along with an older cousin, Lúcia de Jesus dos Santos, told skeptical elders that they had witnessed six apparitions of the Virgin between May 13, 1917, and Oct. 13, 1917, when Jacinta was 7, Francisco was 9 and Lúcia was 10.

We know what happened thanks to Sister. Lucia, who became a Carmelite nun and, at the request of the local bishop, wrote her memoirs of all the three children had experienced. She recalled that on her third appearance, July 13, the lady clothed in light revealed to them a secret in three parts. First, she let the children see a brief vision of hell—"we saw something like an ocean of fire. Immersed in the fire were the demons and the souls (of the damned), that were like transparent embers, black or bronze, that had human forms." Next, the second secret, Our Lady told them that World War I would soon end but another world war would break out if people did not stop offending God and Russia was not converted. These first two secrets were made public in 1941, but the third—which speaks of the persecution of the church and the assassination of "a bishop dressed in white"—was only revealed by the Congregation of the Doctrine of the Faith in 2000 at the behest of John Paul II, who identified with the bishop being killed and attributed his survival of the assassination attempt on May 13, 1981, to Our Lady of Fatima's intervention.

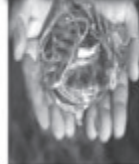
