The exhortation covers a wide range of topics related to marriage and family life as well as the contemporary challenges faced by families throughout the world. It encourages both pastors and members of the laity to accompany and care for families and others in situations of particular need. *Amoris Laetitia* also includes an extended reflection on the meaning of love in the day-to-day reality of family life.

There's a book written for us list lovers called The Incredible Book of Wacky Lists by Patrick M. Reynolds (2001), where he has lists of "Plants That Eat Animals" (there are 4 of them: Venus's flytrap, Butterwort, Sundew, Pitcher plant), "Seas Named After a Color" (Black, Red, White, Yellow Seas), 3 Tallest US Presidents (Abe Lincoln, 6'4", LBJ, 6'3", Thomas Jefferson, 6'2½", now 4, with Barack Obama, 6'2"), "7 Birds That Can't Fly" (emu, kiwi, penguin, ostrich, cassowary, rhea, Galapagos cormorant), "10 Animals with Pockets" (kangaroo, koala, opossum, sea horse, Tasmanian devil, wombat, wallaroo, bandicoot, cuscus, echidna).

Among the 24 predicted extinctions are the imminent demise (some already became extinct!) of the Yellow Pages, movie rental stores, phone landlines, VCRs, Ham radio, incandescent light bulbs, cameras that use film, and the milkman. In fact, some extinctions are good. When things are no longer useful, when things do not function in a helpful way, or just aren't sensible anymore, they should become extinct. In today's Gospel text Jesus acted as an agent of extinction. When Jesus entered into the local synagogue in Capernaum it was time for the unclean spirit inhabiting that place to go extinct. The presence of Jesus, whom the unclean spirit declared to be "the Holy One of God," left no room for the unholy attitude and actions of that demon. Go exorcize some demons this week. Make a list of things you want to go extinct in your life, and then stop feeding them: greed, jealousy, anger, hypocrisy, selfishness Change the climate in your home and in your heart. Make the climate in which you live inhospitable to hatred, a wasteland for bigotry, a desert for envy.

SUNDAY REFLECTION: Don't "Help" Them!

Jesus taught as one having authority and not as the scribes . . . Jesus rebuked the unclean spirit: "Quiet! Come out of him!" Mark 1: 21-28

A newly-launched charitable foundation began work among the mountain people of Nepal. Their focus was supporting women and girls. But their first project was an epiphany for the organizers.

Their team was touring a small village in Nepal. They were impressed by a long concrete staircase leading up the mountain to a village perched on a ridge. The steps certainly made it easier to navigate the steep path. But they couldn't help but notice the well-worn track in the dirt alongside the steps. When they reached the top, they asked the villagers about the path. Their inquiry was met with a chorus of nervous giggles.

The villagers explained that, a year before, a visitor had a great deal of difficulty trekking up the hill to the village, sliding on the slippery path. The well-to-do and well-meaning traveler was concerned about the women carrying heavy jars of water on their heads. He vowed to do something to help them, so he arranged for the construction of the steps. After the steps were completed, he made a great display of "presenting the steps" to the village, and then he returned to his home. The women tried to use the steps but suffered many injuries as they lost their balance and fell with their water jars. They were used to feeling their way up the dirt path in their bare feet, not having to look down and risk spilling the water they were carrying. So they bypassed the steps and created a new path along side the concrete.

What would have been a better solution? the team asked. The villagers laughed. "If he had built a well at the top of the hill, the women wouldn't have to carry the water up the hill at all!" It was an object lesson for the foundation team. They realized that they could not "impose" programs from the top down. Any new projects would begin by listening to those they were trying to help. As a Nepalese woman who would become involved in one of the foundation's future projects would later remind them, "We're poor, not stupid."

Our wanting to help others sometimes takes on an air of disdain and condescension: Because we are more well-to-do or went to a better school or live in an upscale "zip code," we assume we know what's best for those we have "deemed" to "help." That attitude is exactly what Jesus' authority is NOT about. The people who encounter Jesus see in him a very different kind of "authority," an authority centered in empathy, compassion and respect. Jesus' "authority" inspires rather than enforces; he sees his call to "lead" as a trust, as a responsibility to serve others by revealing the God who calls us to compassion and mercy for the sake of his kingdom of peace, instead of a God of judgment and vengeance. May we seek to possess the authority of the Gospel Jesus: to listen with the compassion of the heart, to stand with (not above) those in need, to join our hands with those who are struggling up mountain paths balancing their own water jars.


