## Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

Christmas is now behind us, but the beauty, joy and festivities still remain as we reflect on the time we spent with family and friends. Just as we love and are sometimes challenged by our own families, so was the Holy Family. It is clear in our reading this weekend that Jesus presented his family with significant challenges in addition to facing his own inquisitiveness.

First Mary and Joseph find their 12-year-old son missing from the caravan, thinking he was among their family and friends. What must have been going on in their minds as they raced back to Jerusalem hoping to find him?

Then Mary and Joseph likely felt a sense of relief in locating him in the temple only to be challenged by his response to his mother's inquiry, "Son, why have you done this to us? Your father and I have been looking for you with great anxiety." And he said to them, "Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" Their frustration must have been overwhelming. What parent has not been frustrated with their child?

Clearly the Holy Family experienced extraordinary challenges in raising Jesus, but perseverance and supportive persons around them provided the platform for which Jesus could grow into a man and our Savior.

Still today our family is our core support, but family is more than a genetic tie. It is love, trust, faith and guidance. Who are those people in our lives? Whoever they are, we pray with a gracious and thankful heart for all they have given us. Perhaps you sat next to them in church today.

The day is upon us when we make that New Year's resolution..... what will it be? What was it last year?

**Good News I found it!!** Last year Fr. Abraham charged us out with a clear resolution -"A blessing a day keeps the doctor away – The power of looking at the blessings we have rather than bemoaning the loses and wishing for what could have been, is truly beneficial to our body, mind and soul".

Thank you Father. Now let's go forward and count our blessings. I am grateful for the time we had with Fr. Abraham and all that I learned from him and I now look forward our journey ahead which we travel together as a family in Christ.

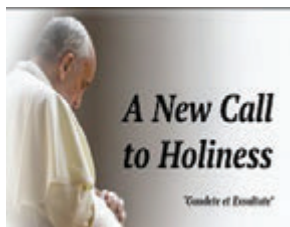

## THE HOLY FAMILY: "First Man"

*"Son, why have you done this to us? Your father and I have been looking for you with great anxiety."*

*Luke 2: 41-52*

*The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.*

*John 1: 1-18*

The new movie **First Man** tells the story of Neil Armstrong, the first man to set foot on the moon. But the film is about much more than space travel.

**First Man** is also the story of a family coping with the struggles and challenges of life on earth. Neil Armstrong is a quiet, reserved, focused pilot and engineer who possesses that rare ability to immediately analyze a problem and correct it. But he is much more comfortable dealing with problems in space than on earth.

While applying to fly in the Gemini space program, Neil and Janet's two-year-old daughter Karen dies of cancer. Karen's death looms large over **First Man** and turns an already taciturn man further inward.

Neil and Janet are a loving couple but their daughter's death has driven a wedge between them. Neil finds refuge in his work, his emotions churning so many miles below the surface that they barely register. Janet is a very traditional mid-century suburban wife but, in her own way, as honest and determined as her husband. She is proud of her husband but nervous with the knowledge that the astronauts are "a bunch of boys playing with balsawood models." She realizes the dangers that NASA tries to diminish and her husband refuses to discuss. In one of the movie's most powerful scenes, Janet insists that her husband sit down with their sons before the moon voyage to answer their questions about the dangers he was facing.

At Neil's interview for the Gemini program, astronaut Peter Conrad says to Neil, "Neil, I was sorry to hear about your daughter." Neil replies, "I'm sorry, is it a question?"

Conrad stammers, "What I mean is: Do you think it'll have an effect?" Neil responds without a hint of emotion, "I think it would be unreasonable to assume that it wouldn't have some effect."

Science may take humankind to the outer reaches of space, but does little to alleviate the emotional pain of living with loss.

**In today's Gospel, Mary and Joseph experience the unimaginable anxiety of losing their child. While Luke includes the story as a sign of what is to come in Jesus' life, it is also a story of the challenges and struggles of family life. Neil and Janet Armstrong lived the pains and doubts and despair that are part of every marriage and family. May we give thanks this Christmas Sunday for the gift of family and, in the New Year, take on, out of love and care for those we love, the hard, Christ-like work of being family to one another.**

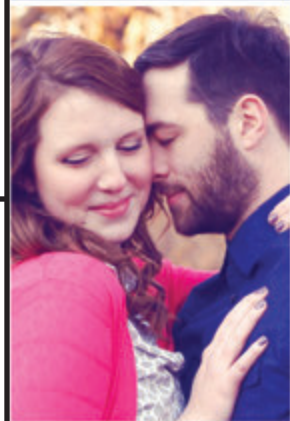
