EASTER: The Resurrection of the Lord

[The women] found the stone rolled away from the tomb; but when they entered, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus . . .

"Why do you seek the living among the dead? He is not here, but he has been raised."

Luke 24: 1-12

Living among the dead isn't . . .

Numbers surround him. He is enclosed by screens that flash numbers and graphs at him all day long. When to buy, when to sell, the trends to watch for. He lives for those numbers — but he can't see beyond them. He is blind to the lives that those numbers represent, and the hopes and dreams of those lives. He only cares about the numbers to the extent that they add or subtract from his portfolio.

Why do you seek the living among numbers? the angel will ask him on that day when the screens finally go dark.

Things in her life just haven't turned out the way she had hoped. Her own career stalled early on. She and her husband haven't been able to live the Architectural Digest lifestyle she always imagined for herself. Her kids — good kids — have disappointed her in so many ways, from their careers to their spouses. She has become cynical and angry — and alone.

Why do you seek the living in a tomb of disappointment you dug for yourself? the angel asks — but there are no such angels in her world.

"Don't answer that just yet," the campaign manager advises. "Let's test it — see where your constituency is with this." The candidate knows the stand that he or she should take, but that's not the question. The question is always: *What response keeps me in office? What position wins the next election?*

Why do you seek the living among polls? the angel will ask after the last vote is tallied.

You've heard it before: *Be afraid of them. They're out to get us and our jobs and our country. We've got to put a stop to them before it's too late. They're different. They don't share our values — they don't even speak our language. Look, I'm not a racist or bigot, but we gotta protect our own. You've heard it all. But you've gotten to know some of "them" and you know otherwise. They're your neighbors and friends and they love their families and community as much as you love yours.*

You hear the angel: *Why do you seek the living in the midst killing fear and deadening hate?*

The question asked by the angel of the women on Easter morning is asked of us every morning of our lives: **Why do we seek the living among the dead? Why do we expect meaning from what is doomed to nothing? Why do we center our days on things of limited value when God's love and grace abounds in our lives? Easter is God's never-ending invitation to freedom, his raising us up from "tombs" of selfishness and fear and anger and hatred. In the light of Easter's empty tomb, every moment of forgiveness, every triumph of justice over persecution, every insistence of goodness in the face of horrendous evil, every act of compassion (no matter how simple or small) proclaims the good news that Christ is risen. On this Easter Sunday, may we seek to bring such resurrection to the darkness and shadows around us; may we "bury" our own self-interests and wants for the sake of the greater good; may we allow ourselves to "die" in order that God may restore us to life in the wellspring of compassion and mercy that is the Risen Christ.**

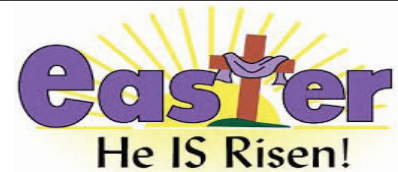

A REAL, HONEST-TO-GOD EASTER EGG

A small chick begins the long journey to birth. The not-yet-a-bird weighs little more than air; its beak and claws are barely pin pricks. The bird-to-be is in its own little world: protected by the rigid shell, warmed by the mother hen's body, nourished by the nutrients within the egg's membrane.

But then the chick begins the work of life. Over several days the chick keeps picking and picking until it can break out from its narrow world — and into an incomparably wider one.

But for this to happen, the egg has to go to pieces. New life demands shattering the old.

That's the **real** Easter egg. Not a complete egg dyed and painted with so many designs and colors.

Not an egg that has been hardboiled, impossible to shatter. Not an egg made of chocolate.

The real Easter egg is shattered and destroyed. The real Easter egg exists in broken pieces. The real Easter egg is cracked opened, yielding new life that has taken flight.

For centuries, the world has marked the Resurrection of the Lord with eggs. But the Easter meaning of the egg is found in the struggle of the chick to free itself from its confines so as to take flight into the much bigger world beyond it. We struggle to break out of a world that we perceive as going to pieces; we pick away at an existence that leaves us dissatisfied and unfulfilled. The promise of the Easter Christ is that we can break out of our self-contained little "shells" and take flight into a much bigger world: a world where peace and justice reign, a world illuminated by hope and warmed by love, a world that extends beyond time and place into the forever of God's dwelling place.

EASTER GIVES US HOPE: "I'M WITH YOU ALWAYS!"

Have you heard the story of the man whose hobby was growing roses? When he worked in his rose garden, he always whistled. It seemed to everyone that he was whistling much louder than was needed for his own enjoyment. One day a neighbor asked him why it was that he always whistled so loudly. The man then took the neighbor into his home to meet his wife. The woman was not only an invalid, but was completely blind as well. The man, you see, was whistling, not for his benefit, but rather for the benefit of his wife. He wanted his blind wife to know that he was nearby, and that she was not alone. That story is a wonderful illustration of the significance of Easter Day. The affirmation, "Christ is risen!" reminds us that God is near, and the experiencing of His presence strengthens us in our weakness. The living presence of the Risen Lord gives us lasting peace and celestial joy in the face of the boredom, suffering, pain and tensions of our day-to-day life. "Peace be with you" was Jesus' salutation to his disciples at all post-Resurrection appearances. For the true Christian, every day must be an Easter Day lived joyfully in the close company of the Risen Lord.

WHY BELIEVE IN THE RESURRECTION?

If someone challenges you to prove the resurrection of Jesus, here are **TEN good answers**: (1) Jesus himself testified to his Resurrection from the dead (*Mark 8:31; Matthew 17:22; Luke 9:22*). (2) The tomb was empty on Easter Sunday (*Luke 24:3*). Although the guards claimed (*Matthew 28:13*) that the disciples of Jesus had stolen the body, every sensible Jew knew that it was impossible for the terrified disciples of Jesus to steal the body of Jesus from a tomb guarded by an armed, 16-member Temple Guard detachment. (3) The initial disbelief of Jesus' own disciples in His Resurrection, in spite of His repeated apparitions, serves as a strong proof of His Resurrection. Their initial disbelief explains why the Apostles started preaching the Risen Christ only after receiving the anointing of the Holy Spirit on the day of Pentecost. (4) The transformation of Jesus' disciples: Jesus' Resurrection and the anointing of the Holy Spirit transformed men who were hopeless and fearful after the crucifixion (*Luke 24:21, John 20:19*), into men who now were confident and bold witnesses to the Resurrection (*Acts 2:24, 3:15, 4:2*). (5) Neither the Jews nor the Romans could disprove Jesus' Resurrection by presenting the dead body of Jesus. (6) The Apostles and early Christians would not have faced martyrdom if they were not absolutely sure of Jesus' Resurrection. (7) The Apostle Paul's conversion from a persecutor of Christians to a zealous preacher of Jesus supports the truth of Jesus' Resurrection (*Galatians 1:11-17, Acts 9:1, Acts 9:24-25, Acts 26:15-18*). (8) The sheer existence of a thriving, empire-conquering early Christian Church, bravely facing and surviving three centuries of persecution, supports the truth of the Resurrection claim. (9) The New Testament witnesses do not bear the stamp of dupes or deceivers. The Apostles and the early Christians were absolutely sure about the Resurrection of Jesus. (10) If Jesus had not been raised bodily from the dead, Christianity would never have survived as a Messianic movement on a lie!

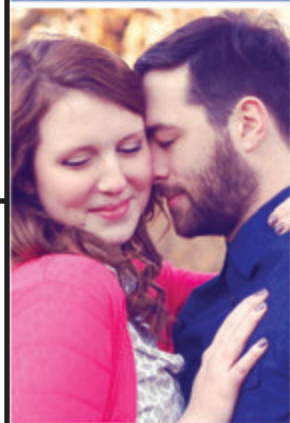

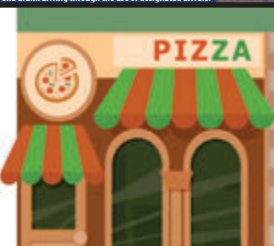

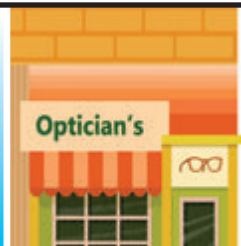
