"You are witnesses of these things."

Luke 24: 46-53

"... that they may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you ..."

John 17: 20-26

The day her mom died, they drove two hours to the family home. On the drive, she fretted over the immediate and the practical: *What are we going to do with the house and all that stuff?* And she began to grieve: *How will I live in a world without her?*

They spent that first day packing up Mom's clothes and making a first sort of her papers. That evening they had supper at the Ninety-Nine, Mom's favorite restaurant. And in Mom's honor, Mom's beloved martinis all around: "To Mom!"

The couple on their left asked what they were drinking to. She explained that they were toasting her mother, who had just passed away. As they talked, they discovered that the couple knew her mother from church and told of her mom's many kindnesses. They promised to say a prayer for her.

An older man and his middle-age son sat down on their right. They began talking. "Are you from around here?"

"No, we live two hours from here. My mother lived here, but she died this morning."

"I'm sorry. Can I buy you a drink to toast your mother?"

"Yes, thank you. She — I — would love that."

And as they toasted Mom and the stories continued, they discovered that her mother and the older man grew up in a nearby town. His parents emigrated from Italy. He told of the kindness and welcome Mom's family extended to his family, who faced discrimination and bigotry as immigrants.

It turned out to be a wonderful evening of celebrating a woman's life. Her daughter left still heartbroken — but she no longer wonders how she can live in a world without her. Mom showed her that evening that she will always be with her.

Today's feast of the Ascension celebrates both an ending and a beginning; today marks both an absence and presence: Jesus has returned to the Father but remains fully alive with us in his spirit of compassion and humility that inspires us, motivates us, compels us to take on the work of being his witnesses and proclaimers of his Gospel. In every kindness we extend, in the principles of justice and mercy we advocate for, in making reconciliation a reality in the midst of division and discord, we reveal the presence of the Risen One to our broken and struggling world.

NOTES FROM THE GARDEN



We had a beautiful day for spring planting on May 18. Many hands made light work and a new mechanical seeder for carrots worked great. Plan a visit the garden to see what we are growing this year. The amaryllis planted by the First Communion children are sending up buds--come take a look. We have been picking loads of asparagus--10-15 pounds per week since mid-April. Cutting will continue until June 1. They will be served fresh at SHIP's Galley Soup Kitchen twice this month. Allium, pansies and poppies are in bloom right now. Asiatic Lilies and roses are not far behind. We will have our annual strawberry harvest in early June. Many of the folks who have community garden beds help with this task but picking is open to all members of the community. Please contact Anne Germino at project-earth@ccsjn.org by May 28 if you would like to help. All of the strawberries are donated to SHIP or Elijah's Promise Soup Kitchen in New Brunswick. We will need help with picking as well as delivery to the soup kitchens.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK IS NOT WHAT YOU THINK

If you are going into the hospital for an operation, sick or chronically ill the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick gives strength and support and can be administered to anyone struggling with an illness. Many think Anointing of the Sick is meant for Last Rites at the time of death. Unlike the traditional understanding of the Last Rites, the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is available to offering healing and comfort in times of illness that may not lead to immediate death. The healing that occurs in this sacrament of anointing is not necessarily physical healing. While we believe that physical healing can occur through the great power of God, the grace that is infused through this special sacrament is the reminder of the eternal presence of God in our human suffering. This Sacrament is also available to anyone struggling with mental or emotional difficulties. The priest, in blessing the oil of anointing, asks God to "send the power of your Holy Spirit, the Consoler, into this precious oil. Make this oil a remedy for all who are anointed with it; heal them in body, in soul and in spirit, and deliver them from every affliction" (Pastoral Care of the Sick, #123). "AMERICAN MOONSHOT"

This summer marks the 50th anniversary of arguably the greatest scientific accomplishment in history: the night of July 20, 1969, when Americans Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin walked on the surface of the moon.

The story of America's quest to the moon is told in a fascinating new book by Rice University historian Douglas Brinkley: **American Moonshot: John F. Kennedy and the Great Space Race.**

When Kennedy took office, America was cautiously experimenting with rocketry and space exploration. With the Russians' successful launch of Sputnik in 1957, space exploration took on a new urgency. In a speech to Congress, the new President made this astonishing commitment: "I believe this nation should commit itself to achieving the goal, before the decade is out, of landing a man on the moon and returning him safely to earth."

Despite the ambitious goal, neither a policy nor an agency existed to realize it. But, as Brinkley writes, President Kennedy marshalled the resources and talent from the civilian, military, corporate and educational sectors to "leapfrog" the early Russian achievements and take the lead in the "space race." For Kennedy, going to the moon was about winning, about beating our Russian Cold-War adversaries — but it was about more. At Rice University, President Kennedy spoke of his vision of America's space program as the noblest illustration of the American pioneer spirit, a journey that would open not only new frontiers but new technologies in communications, medicine and transportation: among other things, we can thank Project Apollo for our cell phones and cordless appliances and tools, for our cars' radial tires and the laser technology that make many surgical procedures possible.

"We choose to go to the moon in this decade and do the other things," President Kennedy said at Rice, "not because they are easy, but because they are hard, because the goal will serve to organize and measure our best energies and skills, because the challenge is one that we are willing to accept, one we are unwilling to postpone, and one which we intend to win."

In his brief Presidency, John F. Kennedy articulated a vision for America's great space adventure that harnessed the imagination and talents of our nation as never before. The night before his death, at supper with the Twelve, Jesus articulates a similar vision: a church brought together to realize his vision of the Kingdom of God, a vision centered in the conviction that, in God, we belong to one another, a vision that lifts up and honors the gifts that each one of us brings to this table. In his "high priestly prayer," Jesus prays that the extraordinary sense of love that binds the Father to the Son will bind us to one another — and so bound in that life, we may realize God's vision that can transform our world in the extraordinary peace and limitless mercy of God.

ASCENSION TO PENTECOST

We need to see Jesus every day. We need to hear his voice, to receive his love, and to be formed by his wisdom. As St. Paul taught, Jesus gave us the Spirit "so that we may understand the things freely given us by God" (Corinthians 2:12). We need the Spirit to give us the grace we need to live out Jesus' commands. Without the Holy Spirit, we limit both our understanding and our abilities. From now until Pentecost, let's dive in to Scripture, fix our eyes on Jesus, and persist in prayer. Let's ask for the grace to see Jesus with new eyes, the eyes of the Holy Spirit. "Come, Holy Spirit! Open the eyes of my heart!"

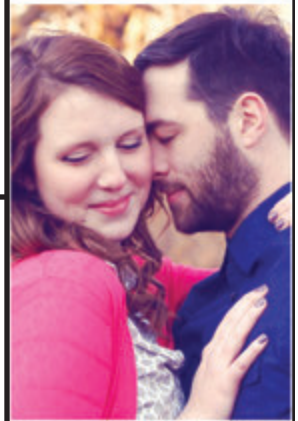
