FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT: The “tempter”

Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert to be tempted by the devil.

Matthew 4: 1-11

You're offered a promotion. The extra money would be great – but you're already stretched pretty thin as it is: you're missing a lot of great moments in your kids' lives and it's starting to eat at you. But the “tempter” whispers to your pragmatic side, *But this is a step forward in your career — and don't forget that salary bump.* You decide *what . . . ?*

It was your fault. You know it was. Your mind wandered off for a moment, then the “crunch” brought you back to reality. You get out of your car to exchange information with the other driver. He's only 17 — and scared to death. He's not hurt, but he's terrified what this could do to his insurance and driving record — not to mention having to face his father. You hear the “tempter” saying, *You should easily slide through this.* But you see you own son or daughter standing there in the cold, digging out his registration and insurance card. And you say *what . . . ?*

You're working on your tax return. You can save yourself a few dollars by fudging a number here or there, claiming a deduction or two you're not entitled to, omitting a few “minor” sources of income. The “tempter” assures you, *All perfectly legal. And who deserves it more — you or the government?* Your complete your 10-40 how . . . ?

The “tempter” is that voice within us that urges us to put ourselves first, that places our wants and expectations before the needs of others, that rationalizes our avarice and negates our responsibility to the greater good. The “tempter” who challenges Jesus is a reality in our lives as well; he “speaks” to our worst side, our selfish interests, as we struggle to make decisions and choices. Let this Lent be a desert experience of confronting the “tempter” and discover the wisdom and grace to choose God's life of compassion and peace.

LENTEN OBLIGATIONS

1. The days of fast and abstinence are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
2. All other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence.
3. The obligation of fast applies only to Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59. Fasting in the Catholic tradition means to limit oneself to one full meal and two smaller meals which together are not equal to a full meal, so as to experience hunger.
4. The obligation of abstinence applies to all Catholics who have reached the age of 14.

Abstinence in the Catholic tradition means to abstain from meat.

Giving Your Best

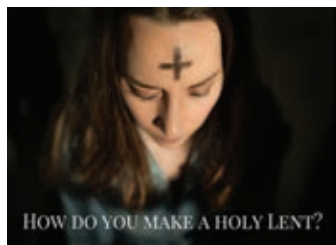
God gives us talents not to build ourselves up with pride, but so we will have something we value to share and give to others.

He had so little, but he gave away the best he had made.

I felt so humbled, for when I first learn to make things well, I want to keep them and hoard my workmanship. God gave us his best in giving us Jesus, God's only Son. Jesus gave us his best, in giving his life for us.

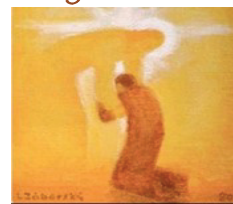

(Deuteronomy 30:15-20)

Do you want Lent to be fruitful this year? Try thinking of it as a journey your taking with the disciples as Jesus prepares for his passion, death and resurrection. You will hear Jesus preach and tell parables/ you will see him heal and feed the needy. How will you respond? Each day, each step of the journey gives you another chance to choose to follow him.

Following the Lord requires choosing. Choosing to follow God gives us life. So go ahead and spend a little more time in prayer or Scripture reading. Attend services at church, give to the poor, wash your family's dirty dishes with a smile.

"STUCK . . ."

A minister was leading a Bible study group in a women's prison. At one point, a young indigenous woman spoke up. She leaned forward with tears in her eyes and said:

"Can I ask a question? I don't know how to say it, but I really wanna know. How do I get 'unstuck'? I'm so tired of making the same mistakes, going back to the same people and problems . . . I don't know . . . I guess I just wanna know how to get 'unstuck.'"

Her words dripped with urgency, longing, dread and pain.

The minister and volunteers leading the group bumbled toward a response, acknowledging how hard it was to break out of patterns of addiction and abuse and dysfunctional relationships and poverty, but that God is "present in the journey."

The minister leading the group later reflected:

"I suspect that even as I grieved for the specific ways in which this young woman was stuck, I was recognizing myself and many of my peers in her words. I suspect we all get to a certain point in life where the word stuck can easily creep into our vocabulary. Passion for the job seems more elusive, the sizzle of a marriage wanes, faith seems more remote and inaccessible. In whatever domain of life, we settle into familiar and predictable rhythms. We realize that there are things about our lives, our communities, our world that are rather hard to change . . . I thought of all these things as I drove home from the jail. I thought about how it's not just individuals who get stuck, but relationships, businesses, churches, institutions, even cultures. And I prayed. For all who feel stuck and for all the ways in which we need to get unstuck to live the lives we were created for."

The season of Lent is a call to become "unstuck": to discern those areas of our lives that have become "stuck" in self-centeredness, monotony, hopelessness and isolation. During these forty days of Lent, the Spirit of God leads us to rediscover the presence of God in our lives, to walk with Jesus in the landscape of the heart. May Jesus' spirit of compassion and his light of wisdom enable us to get "unstuck" in order to live our lives in the fullness of God's grace.

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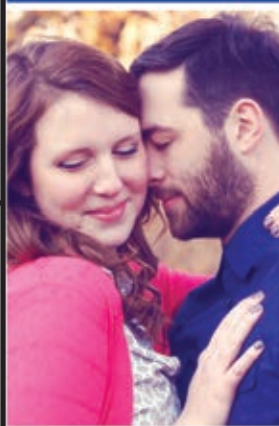
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
