13TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: Tiger's comeback

"No one who sets a hand to the plow and looks to what is left behind is fit for the Kingdom of God." Luke 9: 51-62

Whether you play golf or not, you had to cheer for Tiger Woods' extraordinary comeback at this year's Masters' Tournament. The 43-year-old golfer pulled off what many are calling the greatest comeback in sports history. Tiger Woods' winning his fifth Masters' title and 15th major tournament by one stroke ended a decade-long championship drought.

Between his 14th and 15th victories, Tiger Woods suffered a devastating series of personal and physical defeats: his infidelity cost him his marriage and made his life fodder for the tabloids; he tore ligaments in his knee, and a series of back operations left him in agonizing pain and addicted to prescription painkillers.

What turned Woods around, he said, was his children's "infectious happiness." In their own way, ten-year-old Charlie and 11-year-old Samantha got their dad back on top. They loved him unconditionally and completely. Until this year, Charlie and Samantha had never been to Augusta. They knew that their father was a legend in the sport, but they only saw the tension and despair it brought him, not the glory. Woods was determined to recover and return to the top of his game — but by balancing his competitive drive with his dedication to Charlie and Samantha.

While pundits doubted he'd ever play again, his commitment never wavered. What many fail to appreciate is the patience required to do what Tiger did: the long hours in the gym and on the golf course to regain his physical stamina and focus. But through his darkest days of hopelessness, of working through the kind of infuriating physical pain that back injuries create, the unqualified love and support of his family kept him pushing forward in his rehab — not for the sake of the sport, but for the sake of his family; not to be a great golfer, but to be a great father.

"I was very fortunate to be given another chance to do something that I love," Tiger said, after donning his fifth Masters' green jacket. "But more importantly, I've been able to participate in my kids' lives in a way I couldn't for a number of years."

Jesus' responses to the three would-be disciples sound, at first, insensitive, almost cruel. But Jesus is challenging us to recognize that discipleship requires us to make clear, unambiguous choices and set focused priorities if we are to realize in our lives God's vision of compassion, peace and justice. Consciously or unconsciously, we let so many agendas, interests and expectations monopolize our time and attention and energy to the point where we lose sight of what is authentically important and affirming and meaningful in our lives. To follow Jesus requires us to let go of our own needs and wants, our fears and doubts, in order to free ourselves to do truly great things for the love of God.




