22ND SUNDAY ORDINARY TIME: Taking the “lowest place”

The parables of the “lowest place” and the banquet.

Luke 14: 1, 7-14

On a morning you're running late (of course!), a construction detail is forcing two lanes of downtown traffic into one. The demolition derby is underway; with many cars battling to squeeze into the one open lane! Compounding the confusion, some drivers believe that their schedules are so much more important, so they honk and scream their way ahead of everyone else. Such tangled commutes should make us pause and realize the patience and humility of the “lowest place.”

Perhaps you're trying to get two hours' worth of errands done in 30 minutes. You're making good time — until you hit a line at one store. The sales associate is young — and new. She's struggling to help a customer who has an endless stream of questions. The clerk doesn't know the stock well enough to answer all the questions so constantly has to consult the manager. Meanwhile, the line is growing longer and your patience is growing shorter. Every customer's order is a struggle for the poor young woman. By the time it's your turn to check out, you're barely civil to her. You need to calm down and take the “lowest place.”

Here's another scenario! You love having people over for dinner. But you've made it clear: it's your kitchen. Everyone's welcome to gather and enjoy a glass of wine — but **PLEASE DON'T HELP!** Your guests appreciate your hospitality — but chances are they would enjoy the evening even more if there was more of *you*. So perhaps you might take your foot off the gas and welcome their contributions to the feast; let them help with the clean-up. Cede control for the sake of the “lowest place.”

The “lowest place” Jesus speaks of in today's Gospel is more a matter of attitude than location, a question of generosity rather than place setting. Jesus asks us to see one another from the perspective of Christ-like humility. We are not the center of all things but part of a much larger world. We must embrace a spirit of Gospel-centered gratitude for all the blessings we have received, not because of anything we have done to deserve them, but only because of the complete and unconditional love of God for us.

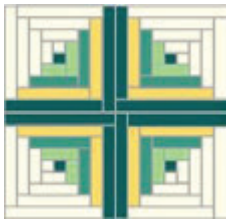

OUR DEDICATION QUILT

Did you notice the “new” quilt hanging behind the altar? For many it is new; for long-time parishioners it is a dear, old friend. Here is its history.

In the beginning there were no quilts. As the church and parish took shape, two of the original members who are quilters (but have since retired and moved away) had an idea. Our founding pastor, Fr. Mickiewicz, who is a big fan of quilts, agreed. So Paula Weller and Mary Beth Staiano made the quilt you are looking at today.

On January 5, 1991, the day of the blessing of the St. John Neumann Church Center by Bishop Edward T. Hughes on the Feast of St. John Neumann¹, Paula and Mary Beth placed this quilt on the Altar. In subsequent years this quilt was used as the Altar cover for the Epiphany weekend celebrations and its meaning was worked into Fr. Bill's homilies. That is why this quilt is named “The Dedication Quilt”.

During the past several years that annual tradition dwindled away. Fr. Rick saw the quilt and suggested we switch it out with our “Logo Quilt” during this long, liturgical season of Ordinary Time. It had never been hung before. A new tradition is born!

Please take time to look at it and reflect on its many crosses. Are they crosses to bear? Do they represent the many paths that cross in our Catholic Community of St. John Neumann as we journey to Christ through His Cross? What does it say to you?

MAKING MOREY PART OF THE PARTY

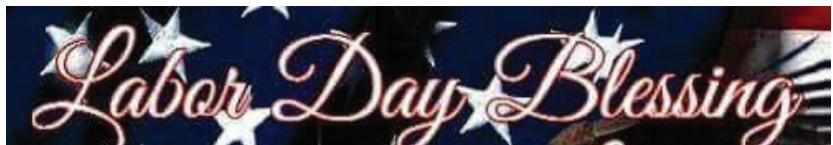
Six-year-old Morey Belanger has a severe hearing impairment — but she's also a typical kid. Which is why, when it came time for kindergarten, her parents were torn: Should they send her to a special school for the deaf or to the public school in their town of Dayton, Maine? The public school had minimal support for kids like Morey — in fact, they weren't any other deaf children in the school. Her parents imagined the worst, especially kids making fun of Morey.

But, as it turned out, talking to Morey has become all the rage at her school. The kids at Dayton Elementary have all started to learn sign language. Obviously, they're not fluent yet, but about a third of the kids know enough to navigate a kindergarten conversation with Morey. For example, when Morey didn't notice the lunch line was moving, a girl made the sign for "walk," followed by the universal sign for "Way to go, Morey!"

And it's not that the school mandated this. There's no sign language in the curriculum. This is "bottom-up kindness." What they know they've learned mostly from posters, books, watching Morey's aide and teaching each other. The kids just want to connect with this one little girl, to make her feel comfortable and safe and able to make friends.

Morey's mom and dad say she will eventually need more support services — but, for now, all she needs she has in this loving community.

Morey's friends are the personification of the "banquet" of humanity envisioned by Jesus. God's table includes places of honor for everyone; to follow Jesus is to be both grateful guest and table server, making sure that everyone finds their place and is welcomed by all.

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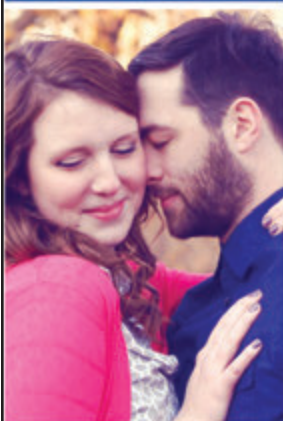
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
