

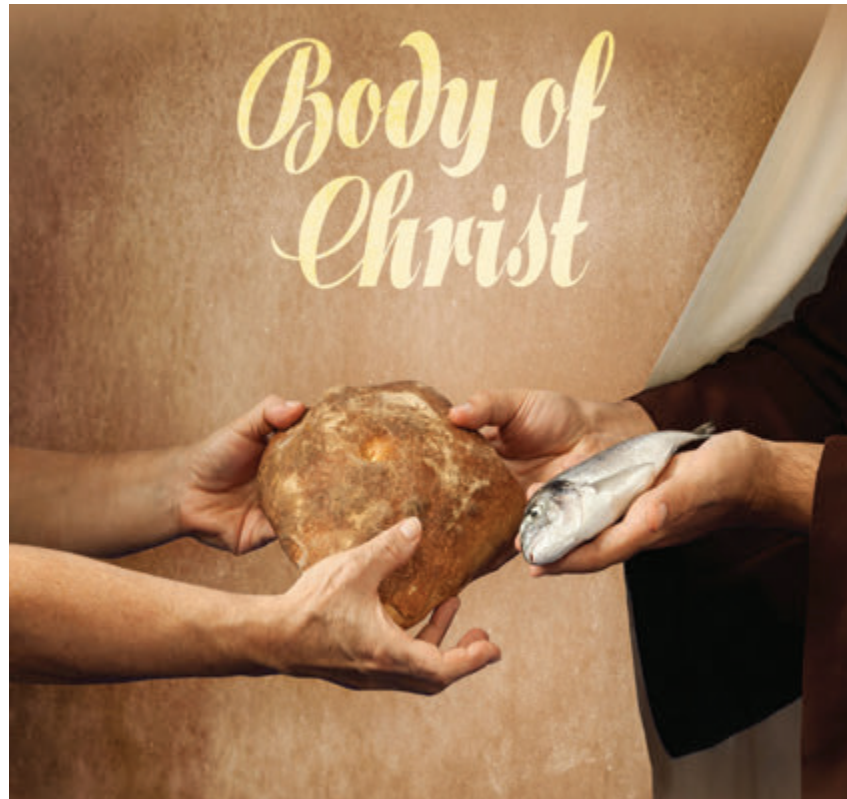

## **THE BODY AND BLOOD OF THE LORD: “Eucharistic” Living**

***Jesus feeds the crowd with the five loaves of bread and two fish. Luke 9: 11b-17***  
***Jesus casts out the demons from the possessed man Legion. Luke 8: 26-39***

In early 2018, 37,000 teachers went out on strike in West Virginia, no longer tolerating the injustices of inadequate school funding by a state government that put tax breaks for extractive industries before children.

For many families, the nine-day strike had consequences more desperate than just no school: it meant that their children would go hungry. For too many children in America — and not just in Appalachia — the only real meal they have each day is in the school cafeteria.

A small Methodist church in West Milford, West Virginia, put into operation a meals program to feed such at-risk children. Parishioners gave their time, money, and energy to make nutritious meals in the basement kitchen for some 1,100 people: kids, parents, and the teachers picketing long hours across the street. The church became not just a place of sustenance but a table of support and consolation where this community’s problems and possibilities were on full display for nine hectic days.

Writing in **The Christian Century** [June 6, 2018], Debra Dean Murphy of West Virginia Wesleyan University describes the scene:

“I was struck by how ‘eucharistic’ it all was. In the sanctuary above that basement, worshipers gather regularly to share in a ritual meal that can seem . . . unrelated to other meals and other kinds of eating. But the simple gifts we take into our bodies at Christ’s table are sustenance for living eucharistically in the world: for practicing the kind of hospitality Jesus practiced when he fed hungry followers and ate with all the wrong people. Our own bodies are meant to nourish other bodies — not to judge them or try to fix them but to love them, and to see that their flourishing (and our own) depends on exposing and redressing systemic inequalities of all kinds. In this way, the Eucharist is always justice in the midst of injustice, reconciliation in the midst of estrangement, communal conviviality in the midst of private pain and loneliness.”

**In today’s Gospel, Jesus creates, through bread (and fish) blessed, broken and shared, a crowd into a community. That same Spirit of generosity and humility works a similar “eucharistic” miracle in a West Virginia church basement. We come here with our struggles and doubts and pains and sorrows and, if the Eucharist is what Jesus intended, we find support and compassion from those who come to the tables with us. The Eucharist compels us to become Eucharist for others: to make the limitless, complete love of Christ real for all in our own acts of charity and kindness.**

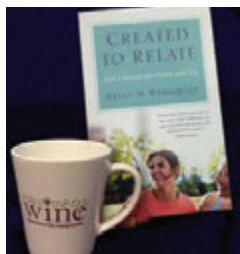

## **KINTSUGI: The art of precious scars**

The Japanese call it the art of **kintsugi** or **kintsukuroi**.

It's more than an art but a parable of healing and reconciliation.

The word *kintsugi* is made up of two Japanese words: "golden" and "repair." It's the technique of repairing broken ceramics or pottery by joining the fragments together with liquid gold, liquid silver or lacquer dusted with powdered gold. Every repaired piece becomes a unique and different work because of the randomness with which ceramics shatter and the irregular patterns formed that are enhanced with the use of precious metals.

According to legend, the *kintsugi* technique was invented around the fifteenth century, when a shogun shattered his favorite tea cup. The shogun sent the pieces to China to be repaired, but the cup was returned with ugly and impractical metal ligatures. The shogun was resigned to the loss of his cup, until some Japanese craftsmen took the cup and transformed it into a jewel by filling its cracks with lacquered resin and powdered gold. The shogun was delighted with his "new," re-created cup.

Through the art of *kintsugi*, what was once broken becomes whole again in a new — and stronger — way; what might be dismissed as ugly "scars" now radiates in the light of someone's meticulous work to make the piece whole again.

**In today's Gospel, Jesus heals the man "possessed" by "demons." Jesus restores the poor man's "brokenness" by the compassion and dignity Jesus affords him; Jesus transforms the possessed man's "scars" into revelations of God's mercy. Jesus calls us to be practitioners of the art of spiritual kintsugi: to mend the broken with the gold of compassion, to repair the fragmented with the silver of humble selflessness, to restore what is to be thrown away with the lacquer of respect and honor as "pieces" of God.**

## **NEW JERSEY INDEPENDENT VICTIM COMPENSATION PROGRAM TO OPEN JUNE 15**

As announced in February, the Diocese of Metuchen - along with the four other Roman Catholic Dioceses in New Jersey (Newark, Trenton, Camden and Paterson) - established an Independent Victim Compensation Program (IVCP) to compensate those who, as children or young adults, were sexually abused by a priest or deacon of the Diocese. The IVCP will be open to claims beginning June 15 and will conclude on December 31, 2019. All individual claims must be submitted during this period.

The state-wide IVCP will be independently administered by Kenneth R. Feinberg and Camille S. Biros, two noted victims' compensation experts who have nationwide experience in administering varying compensation programs such as the Penn State sexual abuse claims, the 9/11 Victim Compensation Fund, and the Boston Marathon bombing compensation fund.

The IVCP will handle the submission, evaluation and resolution of individual claims, and will operate independently of the Diocese or any church-affiliated institution. The administrators of the IVCP will have complete autonomy to determine the eligibility of a claim with the guidelines of the established Protocol. The amount of compensation for those who make a claim will be independently determined by the IVCP administrators. All victims - no matter when the abuse occurred - are eligible to participate, and all matters will be handled confidentially.

Victims of clergy sexual abuse of a minor can begin the process of utilizing the program by going to [www.njdiocesesivcp.com](http://www.njdiocesesivcp.com) and reviewing the protocol for submitting a claim.

The implementation of the IVCP is an important step in aiding victims in seeking justice and healing, and as we journey together as a Church toward a new day.

Transparency, justice and truth, remain a top priority for Bishop Checchio, who in a February letter to the Church of Metuchen, said, "As sad as this day is for the Church, I remember daily that God has called me to this diocese, to be here with you and to walk down this road back to Him with transparency, justice and truth to promote healing, confidence and renewal. The challenges the Church faces now may seem daunting, but we must not fear the days ahead; Christ walks with us. Together, we will journey toward a new day. Even though our Church today inherited these problems from the past, we are to be part of the solution to ensure these horrific crimes are never repeated in the future."

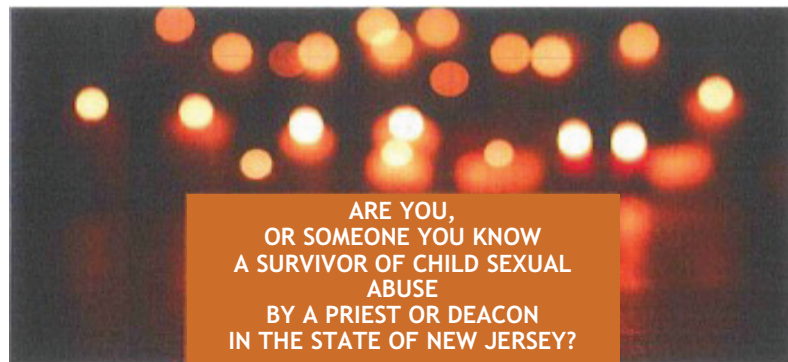
