THE TRINITY



THE MOST HOLY TRINITY: “Adam: God’s Beloved”

“. . . the Spirit of truth . . . will guide you to all truth.”

John 16: 12-15

Father Henri Nouwen was one of the great spiritual writers and teachers of our time. In 1985, exhausted and disillusioned from his crushing teaching and speaking schedule, the Dutch priest withdrew from his teaching post at Harvard and joined the L’Arche community in Trosly, France, the first of over 100 communities founded by Jean Vanier where those with developmental disabilities and those who assist them live together in the spirit of the Beatitudes.

At Trosly, Father Nouwen met Adam Arnett. Adam could not speak or even move without assistance. Grippled by frequent seizures, he spent his life in obscurity. In his last book before his death in 1996, Father Nouwen describes how he became Adam’s caregiver, responsible for feeding him, washing him, dressing him, giving him his medication, transporting him in his wheel chair, getting him to therapy. Having never experienced the world of the intellectually challenged, Nouwen was terrified at first — but through Adam, the priest came to a new and deeper understanding of his faith and what it means to be among the beloved of God.

Father Nouwen writes in his book **Adam: God’s Beloved**:

“Adam’s humanity was not diminished by his disabilities. Adam’s humanity was a full humanity, in which the fullness of love became visible for me, and for others who grew to know him . . . Adam couldn’t say, ‘I love you,’ he couldn’t embrace me spontaneously or express gratitude in words. Still I dare to say we loved each other . . . We were friends, brothers, bonded in our hearts. Adam’s love was pure and true. It was the same as the love that was mysteriously visible in Jesus, which healed everyone who touched him.

“Adam was so fully alive to me, and he shed light on all these questions. This experience cannot be understood by a logical explanation, but rather in and through the spiritual bonding of two very different people who discovered each other as completely equal in the heart of God. From my heart I could offer him some care that he really needed, and from his heart he blessed me with a pure and lasting gift of himself.”

Today’s Feast of the Holy Trinity invites to realize the many ways and the many people in which the love of God is revealed in our lives. For Father Nouwen, such love is present in the innocence of Adam, whose helplessness opened up the dormant compassion and love in Father Nouwen and his L’Arche community. May our own hearts and minds be opened to the Spirit of God revealing the love and hope we are capable of offering, however small and ordinary and unassuming; may the Spirit instill in us the wisdom to discover the goodness in all things and make faithful and hope-filled use of that goodness to transform our lives and world in God’s life and love.

NOTES FROM THE GARDEN



We had a beautiful day for spring planting on May 18. Many hands made light work and a new mechanical seeder for carrots worked great. Plan a visit the garden to see what we are growing this year. The amaryllis planted by the First Communion children are sending up buds--come take a look. We have been picking loads of asparagus--10-15 pounds per week since mid-April. Cutting will continue until June 1. They will be served fresh at SHIP's Galley Soup Kitchen twice this month. Allium, pansies and poppies are in bloom right now. Asiatic Lilies and roses are not far behind. We will have our annual strawberry harvest in early June. Many of the folks who have community garden beds help with this task but picking is open to all members of the community. Please contact Anne Germino at project-earth@ccsjn.org by May 28 if you would like to help. All of the strawberries are donated to SHIP or Elijah's Promise Soup Kitchen in New Brunswick. We will need help with picking as well as delivery to the soup kitchens.

THE CARETAKER OF THE WELL

In the folklore of Haiti, there is a story about a severe drought on the island. All the streams dried up and the wells were parched. There was no place to get water. The animals met to discuss the situation and decided to ask God for help. God responded by creating a well that would provide unlimited water, as long as one of the animals would serve as the caretaker and welcome all who would come in need.

The lizard Mabouya volunteered to be caretaker — but he soon became intoxicated with his newfound power. Mabouya became a gatekeeper, not a caretaker, and sent everyone in need away.

Eventually, God replaced the lizard with the frog, who croaked to all, "Come! This is God's well! The hole in the ground is yours, but the water belongs to God."

Today's Feast of the Holy Trinity calls us to realize the hand of God in every molecule of creation, in every cell of our being — life that God has brought into being out of a love so great and complete that we can hardly imagine it. Our only response to our creation and the world that sustains us is to humbly and gratefully acknowledge God's goodness by becoming well-springs of that goodness to one another, to make it possible for all our brothers and sisters to find their places at God's table.
