24TH SUNDAY ORDINARY TIME: Taking a sharp left from the alt-right

The parables of the lost sheep, the lost coin, and the prodigal son. Luke 15: 1-32

Washingtonian Magazine [May 2019] recently published a touching story written by the anonymous mother about her teenage son “Sam” who got sucked into the internet wormhole of angry propaganda aimed at disaffected males like her son. It took empathy and a stranger’s courage to get him out.

It all began when Sam was falsely accused by another student of sexual harassment. Sam was innocent, but school officials felt obligated to “protect” the girl. Sam was devastated. Sam’s sweet earnestness and desire to do well were gone. His parents decided to move Sam to another school midyear. Sam felt alone and betrayed.

That’s when Sam discovered “alt-right” websites that fed Sam’s anger and distrust with their racist and bigoted rants. With his new online “friends,” his relationship with his mom and dad became more and more strained.

Sam begged to go to Washington’s “Mother of All Rallies,” a gathering of right-wing groups that took place at the Washington Monument in 2017. At first, his mom and dad refused to let him go, but after much pleading, his mom agreed, provided that they would go together and that they would observe, not participate.

Once they arrived, Sam began interviewing as many people as he could. He usually just asked one question, *Why are you here?* and recorded their diatribes on his phone.

Sam was meeting his online heroes and “friends” — and soon realized how unheroic and self-absorbed they actually were. None were as convincing or as witty as they had presented themselves online.

As they were leaving the Mall, Sam and his mom met a middle-aged man who stood alone on the grass, holding a small poster featuring a picture of a smiling Heather Heyer, the demonstrator murdered at Charlottesville in 2017. Under the picture, he had written in magic marker the words *A TRUE AMERICAN PATRIOT* and “c-ville” under her photo, above a hand-drawn heart. Sam’s mom told her son, in front of the man, “Standing up for your beliefs among such a large unfriendly crowd is the definition of courage.”

Sam and the man shook hands — slowly and deliberately — as if they were each transferring something to the other.

And, in the months that followed, the Sam of kindness and sweetness came home.

Sometimes the only way we can bring someone back is to give them the space to turn around and find their own way home. This mom does that for Sam — just as the prodigal’s father does that for his son. She continued to love him enough to let him go and regain his perspective, to realize that he is loved and capable of loving. Such difficult love is but a taste of the great love God has for all of us: love that is eternally forgiving, constantly inviting, never limited or qualified, and, in the end, love that can bridge any distance.

HURRICANE DORIAN RELIEF COLLECTION

As you know, Hurricane Dorian has devastated the islands of the Bahamas. These destructive storms and other natural disasters throughout the world claim lives, displace peoples and devastate communities.

On September 4, Cardinal Daniel N. DiNardo, Archbishop of Galveston-Houston and President of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, issued the following statement regarding Hurricane Dorian,

“As we continue to be vigilant for the effects of Hurricane Dorian as it approaches the U.S. coast, we are extremely mindful of the dire need faced by the community in the Bahamas so devastated by this catastrophic storm...”

Bishop Checchio has authorized a voluntary second collection to be taken in each of our parishes next weekend, September 14-15, to assist with the disaster relief efforts. Payment by check should be noted as “Hurricane Relief” and made out to the Diocese of Metuchen.

Following the collection, all funds should be remitted to the Office of Finance as soon as possible for disbursement to the relief efforts. An online giving option will be created on the diocesan website for those who prefer this method of giving, with donations also coming to the Diocese of Metuchen for disbursement to this disaster relief effort and any future disasters that may require our assistance.

NOTES FROM THE GARDEN

Just when it seems we have reached the full potential of the garden, another year surprises us with more abundance! Every year is different but the explosion of vegetables this year has been a wonderful blessing. We are currently supplying two soup kitchens and a food pantry with deliveries about once a week. In addition, this past week, social ministry leaders delivered boxes of fresh vegetables to 5 local families and a large tray of assorted vegetables to Parkside Manor. Our first planting of carrots exceeded 150 lbs and a second crop is well on its way, ready for another harvest in October. Green beans just won't quit. In addition to delivering 15-20 lbs a week fresh, volunteers have cleaned and processed about 30 lbs that have been frozen for use at SHIP soup kitchen throughout the winter. We brought in about 30 heads of broccoli and 36 heads of cabbage. The harvest will continue for several more weeks. Come on out to the garden to see and while there, enjoy the beautiful flowers, goldfinches and butterflies!

"THE DAY I STOOD SIMMERING IN SHAME..."

In an essay in the **National Catholic Reporter** [January 2014], the late writer and poet Brian Doyle lamented a "sin" he committed that had a sobering and lasting effect on him.

His ten-year-old son had been fighting with his brother for what seemed like an eternity. Dad's demands that he cool it were met with either indifference or snark. Finally, Dad had had enough.

"I roared at my son, I grabbed him by the shirt collar, I frightened him so badly that he cowered and wept, and when he turned to run, I grabbed him by the arm so roughly that he flinched, and it was that flicker of fear and pain across his face, the bright, eager, holy-riveting face I have loved for ten years, that stopped me then and haunts me [still] for I am the father of his fear, I sent it snarling into his heart, and I can never get it out now, which torments me."

As soon as Brian let go of his arm, the boy "sprinted away and slammed the door and flew off the porch and down the street, and I stood there simmering in shame. Then I walked down the hill into the laurel thicket as dense and silent as the dawn of the world and found him there huddled and sobbing. We sat in the moist, green dark for a long time, not saying anything, the branches burly and patient. Finally, I asked quietly for his forgiveness and he asked for mine and we walked out of the woods, hand-in-hand, changed men."

Most of our struggles to forgive are the stumbles we make in hurting those we love most. In the same awkward situation, we can be both the aggrieved father whose discipline is more than justified and the self-centered son who hurts deeply the ones who love him the most. As Brian Doyle learned in his encounter with his son, we all possess the grace to forgive; the love of God empowers us to seek forgiveness and make right what our selfishness has broken or shattered.

All requests for confidentiality are honored, and should be noted when making the request. We all know how powerful prayer can be, and many have experienced the peace, guidance, healing and answers to their needs that prayer can bring. As a community we support one another in prayer.

DO YOU HAVE QUESTIONS ABOUT THE CATHOLIC FAITH?

If you have ever considered becoming Catholic or know someone who may be interested, there is a process to help you discern whether it is what you want to do. RCIA stands for Rite of Christian Initiation. Every year teams in parishes meet with unbaptized persons and those baptized into other faiths to discuss and learn about the Catholic faith. The first stage is called Inquiry and simply put, is a time for you to ask any and all questions about God and the church. This is the period to help you find out if you are interested in becoming Catholic. So please don't think you have to know this is what you want to do. The Inquiry phase helps in that discernment. HOW TO REPORT SEXUAL ABUSE
