	Elements of your Comic Strip	Check?
<b>Story Elements and Structure</b>	<p>Story structure has a beginning, middle, and end.</p> <p>Story elements include theme, characters, setting, plot, and problem/conflict.</p> <p>There is a message, point-of-view and/or emotions, feelings expressed in the storyline.</p>	
<b>Choice of Scenes</b>	<p>Include all the most important events that occur in the comic story and exclude those that don't.</p>	
<b>Captions</b>	<p>Speech balloons are used to define captions.</p> <p>Captions are related to the scenes and the story; communicate ideas, character voices, and sounds.</p> <p>Captions are easy to read and understand.</p>	
<b>Characters</b>	<p>The main characters are clearly identified, and their actions and dialogue are well matched to their actions and dialogue in the book.</p>	
<b>Landscape and Props</b>	<p>Landscape and props are directly related to the theme or purpose of the story and enhance understanding of the scene.</p>	
<b>Illustrations</b>	<p>Illustrations are detailed, and attentive craftsmanship is demonstrated.</p> <p>Tools are used safely and accurately.</p>	
<b>Storyboard Layout</b>	<p>A variety of sizes and shapes are used for the comic panels.</p> <p>Comic panels easily guide readers through the story and provide the reader with a sense of place.</p>	
<b>Spelling, Punctuation, and Grammar</b>	<p>There are no spelling, punctuation, or grammar errors.</p>	

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
