

**NEXT SUNDAY - ALL SAINTS' SUNDAY:** The first Sunday of November is set aside in the church each year to commemorate those who have entered eternal life since last years All Saints' Sunday.

Through their lives we are reminded of the sure and certain hope of the resurrection, which is ours through Jesus Christ.

As part of the worship service we will do a special litany where we remember those in our congregation who have entered eternal life in the past year. One extra candle will be lit for all those we wish to remember silently in our prayers.

**The Order of Confession** is omitted from the service itself but may be read silently in preparation for worship (p.116) The announcement of forgiveness is heard in the Eucharistic liturgy.

**TEMPLE TALK:** Over the next few weeks, we will hear a series of brief temple talks. Each Sunday one Committee of Good Shepherd will share about the ministries they are doing. Today's talk comes from Bill Ketel and the Service Ministry.

## PREPARING FOR WORSHIP

Here are the readings – with a short introduction –that will be read at worship **NEXT** Sunday, November 3 – All Saints Sunday

#### Prayer of the Day

Merciful God, gracious and benevolent, through your Son you invite all the world to a meal of mercy. Grant that we may eagerly follow his call, and bring us with all your saints into your life of justice and joy, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. **Amen.** 

### First Reading: Isaiah 1:10-18

Isaiah announces God's displeasure with the offerings and sacrifices of a people who are without compassion. He urges them instead to do justice and defend the oppressed. Indeed, if they repent, the Lord promises, they will be made as clean as newfallen snow.

# Second Reading: 2 Thessalonians 1:1-4, 11-12

This letter of Paul begins with a typical salutation, blessing, and words of praise for what God is accomplishing among the recipients. By remaining faithful and growing spiritually during hardship, the Thessalonian Christians have become witnesses to the glory of God.

#### Gospel: Luke 19:1-10

Jesus encounters Zacchaeus, a rich man who is also a lost sinner. Moved by Jesus' acceptance of him, Zacchaeus becomes a model of discipleship. In immediate response to being restored to God's people, Zacchaeus ministers to the poor and seeks reconciliation with those whom he has wronged.
