# SHARING OF THE PEACE! - WHAT IT IS, and what it IS NOT!

Did you know that the Peace of the Lord is Biblical?

### The Sharing of the Peace:

It is NOT about making a social visit, and it is not about talking over the Choir when they begin to sing. It is a time for catching up on news with your neighbor, or the latest health concerns, or for reminding someone about an upcoming meeting.

Sharing God's peace does not require each worshiper to walk around the entire church and offer a sign of God's peace to every other worshiper present.

INSTEAD - the "sharing the peace" is <u>an act of reconciliation</u> that is anchored in Jesus' words from the Sermon on the Mount in Matthew 5. If you have a grudge with someone, then make peace before you come to receive the bread and wine at the Table.

It is because of this reconciliation that the Sharing of the Peace serves as a transition point between the Word and Meal portions of the liturgy.

In our congregation this transition is that after the Peace is shared, the choir sings as the offering / our tithes are collected.

That is why when the announcement is made that the offering/tithes are to be taken up you are asked to please return to your seat, stop the talking, and listen to the choir member share their gift of music in an act of worship as you prepare yourself spiritually for Holy Communion.

# Christ the King Sunday is the last Sunday of the Church Year

**Prayer of the Day** O God, our true life, to serve you is freedom, and to know you is unending joy. We worship you, we glorify you, we give thanks to you for your great glory. Abide with us, reign in us, and make this world into a fit habitation for your divine majesty, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

#### Amen.

#### First Reading: Jeremiah 23:1-6

Today's reading builds on the common ancient Near Eastern metaphor of the king as shepherd. Judah's unjust rulers have caused their people, their "flock," to be scattered. Nevertheless, the Lord will raise up a new and righteous shepherd who will rule a restored Judah.

# Second Reading: Colossians 1:11-20

An early Christian hymn praises the mystery of the political, personal, and mystical Christ, the one who was present at creation and is eternally reigning with God.

# Gospel: Luke 23:33-43

Amid scoffing and slander from those who sarcastically call him Messiah and king, Jesus reveals that to be Messiah and king is to give one's life for others. Here he uses his power to welcome a despised sinner to paradise but puts his own death into God's hands.
