Fine Arts Programs

Elementary Music

Elementary students participate in our music program, which allows children to learn music through singing, chanting, clapping, movement, and dance. Students perform two concerts each school year.

Art

All students take visual art classes. Students work through several different mediums and techniques to strengthen their talents and develop new ones.

Band & Choir

Students in grade 5 and up participate in both Band and Choir classes, performing in at least two concerts per school year.

Dance & Drama

Students in grades 6-12 also take dance and drama classes. The students learn various styles of dance, ranging from historical or cultural techniques to Ballet or Modern Jazz. In drama students explore all elements of theatre including set design and costuming, ending with a performance.



High School

- » High school students follow the Michigan Merit Curriculum in addition to their study of the arts.
- » Students may also dually enroll at NCMC, receiving both high school and college credit. Some classes are concurrent (offered on campus here).
