Often referred to as the “university transfer” degree, the Associate in Arts (A.A.) is the smart start toward a bachelor’s degree. FKCC’s popular A.A. program is the same as the first two years at a university—but more affordable and with much more personal attention.

The A.A. is comprised of general education and electives courses totaling 60 credit hours. Students develop a solid educational foundation in small classes led by experienced professors and supported by hands-on advising and learning support services.

FKCC has partnerships with all of Florida’s 12 public and 31 independent universities—creating a “2 +2” pathway for students to earn a bachelor’s degree in four years. All A.A. graduates are guaranteed admission to these universities—making it easy to take the next step.

A.A. Coursework

The Associate in Arts is comprised of 36 credit hours of general education courses, 18 credit hours of elective courses, and 6 credits of special requirements—totaling 60 credits.*

- **Letters: 6 credits**
Subjects include: English composition and speech.
- **Humanities: 6 credits**
Subjects include: literature, philosophy, religion, creative writing, and art history.
- **Mathematics: 6 credits**
Subjects include: algebra, trigonometry, calculus, and statistics.
- **Natural Sciences: 6 credits**
Subjects include: biology, anatomy, marine biology, astronomy, chemistry, and physics.
- **Social and Behavioral Sciences: 6 credits**
Subjects include: history, sociology, economics, political science, and psychology.
- **Additional General Education: 6 credits**
Students choose from general education courses.
- **Computer Literacy: 3 credits**
Subjects include: computer applications and computer programming.
- **Student Success: 3 credits**
This required course prepares students for a successful college experience.
- **Electives: 24 credits**

A.A. students are encouraged to think ahead from the very beginning. Your academic advisor will help you develop a "University Transfer Plan," which will align your elective courses with the major in which you intend to pursue a bachelor's degree. Your academic advisor can help you explore career options and the corresponding majors that suit your interests and skills.

Keep in mind that there may be additional requirements and prerequisite courses that exceed 60 credits, so it is important that you work with your advisor and consult the FKCC Course Catalog.
