HISTORY



A madrigal is a secular vocal music composition of the Renaissance and early Baroque eras usually sung in parts and performed a cappella. This musical form dates back to the 1520s in Italy, where it originated. Later, English and German composers took up the madrigal format. It is usually associated with the "Olde" English tradition, and the Petoskey Madrigal costumes reflect this influence. The young men and women dress in Elizabethan era garments, sewn from heavy tapestry and velvet material which is ornately decorated and all true to the period.

The 2015 Petoskey Schools Madrigals are a group of 30 auditioned singers that meet one hour a day during the regular school year. Their director is Julie Saunders. The group started at the Petoskey High School 40 years ago, and Saunders has been a part of the performances for the last 22 years. They perform traditional carols, some familiar songs, and original, newer compositions.

Each year Northern Michigan is blessed with a series of performances at St. Francis Xavier Church in Petoskey, Stafford's Pier Restaurant, Stafford's Perry Hotel in Petoskey, Stafford's Weathervane in Charlevoix, and the East Jordan Arts Council. During many of these performances the singers perform between courses with a unique meal served at each restaurant. This year, the Petoskey Madrigals will also be performing in Walt Disney World at the end of January.

"The kids are really like a huge family," Saunders said. "They spend many hours together in December and it's great fun to see their interactions with the audiences and their joy in a job well done."
