2016 is the year of Sunday School. For many years it has been said that Sunday School fulfills four aspects of church life. And if the church, and each class, is actively pursing these four aspects, then the church is healthier and alive.

The Teaching Arm of the Church

First, a class environment facilitates teaching and spiritual growth. As "iron sharpens iron, and one man sharpens another (Proverbs 27:17)." Sunday School classes are designed for us to learn from one another and to grow together.

The Fellowshipping Arm of the Church

Second, the smaller environment encourages fellowship that you cannot receive in a large group. Third, the same smaller environment produces a loving, caring environment. While no one else in the church may know that you are hurting, but those that you have fellowship with in a Sunday School class will know and be able to minister to you in a way that no one else will be able to do.

The Evangelism Arm of the Church

Finally, the Sunday School class is the evangelistic thrust of the church. Yes, the gospel should be presented in Sunday School and those who are lost should be saved from hearing a Sunday School lesson. But more important is that church visitation, church outreach, should stimulate from the Sunday School classes. Each class is supposed to contact guest and invite them to their class. Class members should reach out to those who have been absent. Sunday School classes should go out of their way to invite others to come worship and learn with them.

If we work together this year, we can make 2016 the year of Sunday School and watch God work in a way like we have never seen before. Praise God! Let's do His good work.
