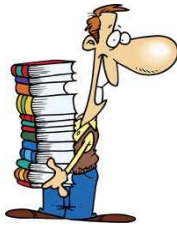
## NOVEMBER is Remembrance Month

- **CCCB Intervention on Bill C-51 and Interfaith letter to Minister of Justice: The Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB) intervened on 30 October 2017 before the House of Commons Standing Committee on Justice and Human Rights concerning clause 14 of Bill C-51, "An Act to Amend the Criminal Code and the Department of Justice Act and to Make Consequential Amendments to Another Act". Under clause 14, the Bill proposes the removal of Section 176 (1,2,3) of the Criminal Code of Canada, which currently makes it an indictable offence to obstruct or cause violence to an officiating clergyman or minister as well as to disturb religious worship or gatherings. Over 60 faith leaders and organization in Canada have signed a letter addressed to The Honourable Jody Wilson-Raybould, Minister of Justice and Attorney General of Canada, concerning the removal of section 176 from the Criminal Code of Canada as proposed under Clause 14 of Bill C-51.
