First Reading: Isa. 49:1-6 This passage marks the beginning of the Second Song of the Suffering Servant of Yahweh. He has a mission as a prophet. He is disappointed about the success of his preaching, yet, in faith, he knows that his “reward is with my God.”

Second Reading: Acts 13:22-26 Paul sees King David both as a type of Jesus and as his ancestor. According to Hebrew thinking, the Messiah would re-establish God’s kingdom on earth; he would be another David. The New Testament authors see Jesus Christ as that new King David, with John the Baptist as his herald.

Gospel: Lk. 1:57-66, 80 Like the other great men of the Bible, John got his name from God. “John” means “God is gracious,” and it indicates his call. John preached to sinners that God is gracious, provided that they turn to God.
