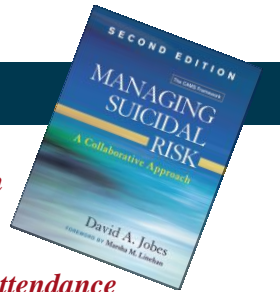

THE WORKSHOP—EVIDENCE-BASED

- *CAMS philosophy and recommended practices*
- *Observe a live "patient" demonstration in which CAMS is used for comorbid suicidality and substance-use concerns*
- *Apply these practices with another clinician in attendance*



Because of the extent to which experiential demonstrations and role plays are emphasized in this training, we **strongly recommend** that you familiarize yourself with the CAMS framework before attending.

Options for doing so include 1) reading the first few chapters of the CAMS manual (<http://www.guilford.com/books/Managing-Suicidal-Risk/David-Jobes/9781462526901>) (Purchase is \$40 on Amazon or \$34 using this link.) 2) completing the CAMS-care online familiarization training (<https://camps-care.com/cams-online-training/>) (price is \$100 for a 7-day pass to watch training videos) or 3) viewing a brief overview on YouTube (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=SEj9KDONX4Q>).

The information emphasized in the manual and the online video training reflects CAMS' current evidence base and recommended practices in a way that the YouTube video does not. However, the YouTube video does offer an opportunity to participants to get a "flavor" of the CAMS framework and see whether they would like to pursue this more formal training.

THE PRESENTER—DR. KEVIN CROWLEY



In addition to serving as a CAMS-care Senior Consultant, Dr. Kevin Crowley works as a Staff Psychologist at Capital Institute for Cognitive Therapy, LLC, and as an Adjunct Instructor at The Catholic University of America. He has conducted risk assessments, delivered suicide-specific treatments, and provided suicide-focused consultation and training through the VA Health Care System and outpatient private practices since 2010.

He has also been involved in several suicide-focused program evaluations and formal research projects through The Catholic University of America's Suicide Prevention Laboratory (Washington, DC) and the Rocky Mountain MIRECC for Suicide Prevention (Denver, CO).

Dr. Crowley's research to date has emphasized brief interventions for reducing shame and suicide risk and considerations for improving the effectiveness of suicide-focused training. He has presented this research and offered clinical workshops at annual conventions of both the American Association of Suicidology and the Association for Behavioral and Cognitive Therapies. In addition, he coauthored an article describing the importance of identifying "drivers" in suicide-focused risk assessment that was published in *Suicide and Life-Threatening Behavior* (<http://onlinelibrary.wiley.com/doi/10.1111/sltb.12161/abstract>)
