## About the Speakers and Presentations:

### **Blurred Lines: What are Ethical Boundaries Anyway?**

Ethical boundaries are an integral part of a relationship. Whether it be professional or personal, they represent invisible structures imposed by legal, ethical, and professional standards that respect the rights of workers and clients. In this training, personal and professional boundaries will be explored, including dual relationships, ethical considerations, and appropriate client/professional interactions.

#### **Lacy Abercrombie, LMSW**

Lacy is a Licensed Master Social Worker who works with the employees of Saint Francis Community Services to provide training and education in the realm of human services. Lacy also provides therapy services through Mindful Matters mental health clinic in Salina, Kansas. He is a Licensed Masters Level Psychologist and Licensed Clinical Psychotherapist with over 40 years of clinical experience in the Community Mental Health Center setting. Mr. Windholz has worked with all psychiatric populations and age groups in inpatient, outpatient and education based settings. With multiple areas of clinical interest, Mr. Windholz' is especially interested in Cognitive based therapies and the present centered approach in the treatment of Anxiety Disorders. His course load at FHSU includes General Psychology, Abnormal Psychology, Mental Health Case Management, Developmental Psychology, Social Psychology, Neuropsychology, Family and Group Therapy, Psychotherapeutic Skills and Practicum Supervision. ### **Strategies for the Management of Mental Health Emergency Situations**

This presentation addresses the problem most mental health clinicians face at one time or another: What to do with a client who is having a mental health crisis. A methodology for efficiently navigating the crisis in order to make a rational decision will be presented. We will also discuss some of the common problems a clinician faces in dealing with clients in crisis and methods for resolving these issues. An emphasis will be on how to provide for the safety of the client as well as minimizing the liability of the clinician.

#### **Cody Sparks LMLP, LCP, LMAC & LAC**

Cody Sparks is a Master's Level Psychologist and Licensed Addiction Counselor who is employed at Central Kansas Mental Health Center (CKMHC) as the Director of Crisis Services and supervises the Crisis Team at CKMHC. He has over 30 years' experience working with people in crisis and coordinating mental health services with community agencies such as law enforcement, schools and hospitals. Cody received his undergraduate degree in Psychology at Baker University. He earned his master's degree in Clinical Psychology from Fort Hays State University and was trained in Family Systems Therapy at the Menninger Foundation. Cody is also an Adjunct Instructor of General Psychology at Wichita Area Technical College in Wichita, KS
