

AN INTRODUCTION TO **KEEPING BEES WORKSHOP** Saturday, December 16, 2017

This workshop introduces a unique overview of beekeeping to those who are interested in local honeybee husbandry and are starting out with limited knowledge and experience. Information is an important first step to anyone's beekeeping success.

Where can honeybees live? What to buy and what not to buy in the supplier's catalog when starting out. Where should I put my hives? How many colonies should I start with?

In addition to a full day of information and handouts, an exhibit of a complete full sized "Langstroth Style" beehive (without the bees) will be demonstrated, along with the uses and advantages of various tools used in the craft of important honeybee biology, the beekeeping. Questions are wel-

The Lake County Farm Bureau comed throughout the entire workshop. The class will be concluded with a honey tasting event.

The workshop instructor, Larry Studer from The Studer Farms, is a local honeybee farmer with "hands-on experience." The Studer Farms has become the leading source of local winter hardy honeybee stock produced in Lake County, IL.

The classroom experience will introduce you to "beekeeping beyond the entry level." The information included in this workshop will help you become a more knowledgeable honeybee colony steward.

The morning class will review functional dynamics of the colony, and discuss several local northern management objectives to maintain healthy and well fed honey bees in all of our four seasons. There will be time for questions and answers.




