MOTOR VEHICLE REGULATIONS FOR ILLINOIS FARMERS

Trucking regulations can be complicated, and farm exemptions compound that complexity. Seems everyone has a different answer to your question.

Come join us at 1:00 on Tuesday, August 7th at the Lake County Farm Bureau office to find out what you need to know.

The Lake County Farm Bureau will be hosting a two-hour seminar that focuses on trucking laws—old and new—specifically for farmers. We'll introduce you to new rules and remind you of the old rules that still apply, and help you identify means of relief. We'll also touch on regulations that apply to travel between states.

Throughout it all, you'll have the chance to ask those farm trucking questions that everyone seems to have an opinion about, but no one can agree on an answer.

Trucking laws have been reshaped in recent

years with more changes yet to come. Rules affected include: farmer exemptions, Harvest Season Emergency permit, longer trucks on local roads, Electronic Logging Devices (ELDs), anhydrous ammonia nurse tank movements, and proof of citizenship requirements.

Presenting the seminar will be Kevin Rund and Kirby Wagner who specialize in farm transportation issues for the Illinois Farm Bureau®. And you'll receive take-home materials covering these topics.

There are two different types of pollination: crosspollination and self-pollination. Cross-pollination is where pollen is transferred between flowers on two different plants. Self-pollination is when pollination occurs within

one flower or between two flowers on the same plant. There are many different kinds of pollinators. They include bees, butterflies, beetles, birds, and bats



Lake County Educators Experience Local Agricultural Businesses

teachers participated in the Lake County Farm Bureau's Annual Educator Agventure. The Agriculture in the Classroom program continues to promote the teaching of agriculture in Lake County classrooms even in the summer months. This Lake County Farm Bureau sponsored event is designed to aid area teachers in incorporating agriculture into their teaching curriculum by providing them with first-hand experience along with lesson plan ideas to bring back to their classrooms.

between July 9th and July 12th with each day lasting from around 8am until 6pm. Twelve stops were featured on the trip, all of which had their own unique ties to agriculture. In addition to the field trip stops, the participating teachers were given educational presentations at the Lake County Farm Bureau office from an Illinois Agriculture in the Classroom and Facilitating Coordination and Agricultural Education representatives. Below is a list and information

about each of the locations the participating teachers visited:

Day #1:

Studer Beekeepers, Wadsworth – The start of the trip was "Buzzing"! LL. Studer Beekeepers provided the teachers with an up-close look of the operations of a honeybee farm. Teachers learned about the importance of honey bees for our agricultural production as bees are one of the many natural pollinators that help our crops thrive. Teachers went

Twenty Lake County area home with a jar of honey as a souvenir from their tour!

Associated Wholesale Gro**cers, Kenosha** – The next stop on the trip was a visit to Associated Wholesale Grocers, which is a grocery distribution center located in Kenosha. The group learned about a very important part of the food supply chain while visiting the bustling warehouse environment. The sheer amount of grocerv items that come in and out of the doors at Associated Wholesale Grocers each day is unbelievable!

Fields & Fences, Gurnee -This year's field trip took place Fields and Fences is a premier equestrian facility that offers an experience for all ages. Teachers learned about the equestrian operation along with the basic needs of caring for a horse. All the participants were given a tour of the barns and stables as well as the opportunity to interact with some of the friendly horses at the facility.

Heinz Orchard, Green Oaks -Heinz Orchard offered the teachers insight into a small apple orchard business. Heinz Orchard is a small, family run apple orchard that is strictly all about picking apples! The teachers enjoyed learning about the care of the trees and how a small orchard can continue to operate while being tucked away in a residential area.

Day #2:

Case IH Plant, Racine - The second day of tours began at the Case IH plant located in Racine. The group learned the history of Case IH, and then toured the production floor where various tracfor customers around the world. The machinery and dedication of the workers at the plant provided an eye-opening view of what it takes to produce farm equipment.

Mighty Grand Dairy, Union Grove - After the group had lunch, Dave Daniels welcomed the group to his dairy farm located in Union Grove Wisconsin. While at Mighty Grand Dairy the teachers learned about all that goes into caring for dairy cows so they can produce milk for a wide variety of products that we enjoy. The cows at Mighty Grand produce milk that is used to make cheese for Grande

Rossi Farms, Bristol - Randall Rossi was next up as a stop on the trip. The group toured Rossi Farms in Bristol, Wisconsin, and learned about raising beef cattle. The teachers toured various barns at this location, which had livestock in various stages of develop-

Thompson Strawberry Farm, Bristol – As strawberry season had just wrapped up, Scott Thompson was able to give the group a tour and presentation at his family farm. The group learned about the history of the farm, as well as how the Thompson family raises strawberries and has a pick your own season for both strawberries as well as raspberries.
