

To the folks and friends of Mt. Zion,

Every year around Christmas, I am drawn to that passage of scripture found in Philippians, Chapter 2, verses 1 through 11. It is often referred to as the '*Christ Hymn*'.

It is here that the apostle Paul reminds us not "*to be jealous or proud, but be humble and consider others more important than ourselves.*" And of course, we know that this is not an easy thing to do.

Paul, however, points us to the Christ who reigns in humility. He calls us to put on the mind of Christ, citing the words of this poignant hymn: "*Christ was truly God. But he did not try to remain equal with God. He gave up everything and became a servant, when he became like one of us. Christ humbled himself. He obeyed God and even died on a cross. Then God gave Christ the highest place and honored his name about all others.*"

This phrase, ". . . *He (Jesus) became like one of us*" reminds us of the meaning of the incarnation; in that God took on human form and entered into our world. This is what Christmas is all about.
