Consecration Sunday

Congregations that approach financial stewardship from a biblical perspective do not view the money Christians give to their church merely as a way to pay its bills. Rather, such congregations see financial contributions as a way to help people grow spiritually in their relationship with God by supporting their church's mission and ministry with a percentage of their incomes.

Our congregation's stewardship committee has selected the New Consecration Sunday Stewardship Program as a way to teach the biblical and spiritual principles of generous giving in our stewardship education emphasis this year.

New Consecration Sunday is based on the biblical philosophy of the need of the giver to give for his or her own spiritual development, rather than on the need of the church to receive. Instead of treating people like members of a social club who should pay dues, we will treat people like followers of Jesus Christ who want to give unselfishly as an act of discipleship. New Consecration Sunday encourages people toward proportionate and systematic giving in response to the question, "What percentage of my income is God calling me to give?" During morning worship on Consecration Sunday, we are asking our attendees and members to make their financial commitments to our church's missionary, benevolent, educational and other ministries in this community and around the world.

Every attendee and member who completes an Estimate of Giving Card does so voluntarily by attending morning worship on Consecration Sunday. We urge people to attend who feel strongly opposed to completing a card. The procedure is done in such a way that no one feels personal embarrassment if he or she chooses not to fill out a card.

We will do no home solicitation to ask people to complete cards. During morning worship our guest leader will conduct a brief period of instruction and inspiration, climaxed by members making their commitments as a confidential act of worship.

We will encourage participation in Consecration Sunday events through the Consecration Sunday team and Church Council members. Since we will make no follow-up visits to ask people to complete their cards, we will make every effort to inform, inspire, and commit everyone to attend Consecration Sunday worship.

Thanks in advance for your enthusiastic participation in Consecration Sunday events.

A Way Forward

Many of you have heard or know about A Way Forward, the recently released report by the Commission on a Way Forward formed by action of the 2016 General Conference of the United Methodist Church. As Bishop Kenneth Carter, President of the Council of Bishops, describes it: "the Way Forward is just that, a path toward the future" of our United Methodist Church. Since 1972, when language was added to the Book of Discipline in regards to homosexuality, there has been a growing number of LBGTQ persons who have sought acceptance within our church, many desiring to serve in the ordained ministry as United Methodist pastors. The Commission's work is in response to what the report describes as the "increasing harm to one another, and a deepening impasse related to human sexuality and the unity of the church" (p. 1 of the report). The reality is that there has been a growing division and conflict between United Methodists as to the inclusion of LGBTQ persons within all facets of our church's life and ministry and mission to the world. The Commission's report offers opportunities for a unified United Methodist Church even amidst a diversity of opinions in regards to LGBTQ persons. A called special session of General Conference will be held in February of 2019 to decide on one of three plans or paths for our denomination.

Your pastors believe that it is important that all the members of Mt. Zion be offered the opportunity to learn about each of the three plans, to ask questions, and to share thoughts and understandings in regards to issues related to human sexuality, all within an environment tempered by Christian hospitality and love for each other. The Small Groups Committee of our church has been planning Conversation/Sharing Sessions to take place during the months of January and February. Four Sunday afternoon sessions will be offered to any who would like to learn more of the background and need for the Commission on a Way Forward, as well as the complexities and ramification of each of the three plans especially as each relates to our congregation.

More information will be coming soon. In the meantime, the entire report of the Commission can be found on the denomination's website www.umc.org. You can also find the three plans presented as petitions for review to the Judicial Council of the UMC by using the Judicial Council tab on the UMC website. In addition, the recent presentation on a Way Forward by the Rev. Tom Berlin (a member of the Commission) is now available on You Tube (Commission on a Way Forward [NBUMC Townhall] starring Rev. Tom Berlin). More resources and updates will be listed in future Pointers and Epointers. Also pray for our church—Mt. Zion and the UMC—for unity and love to prevail. Our bishops are inviting all of us to join in prayer each day from 2:23-2:26 which corresponds to the dates of General Conference, February 23-26, 2019.





Stephen Ministers are there:

- ... after the phone call you hoped you'd never get.
- ... after the funeral, when everyone has left and the emotions you've held at bay come crashing in on you.
- ... after the relationship falls apart and the bottom falls out of your life.
- . . . after the doctor says, "I'm sorry, but there's nothing more we can do."
- ... after the nursing home director shakes your hand and says, "Welcome to your new home."
- after the last child honks the horn, waves, and drives away—and the house suddenly seems empty.
- ... after the gavel comes down, the handcuffs go on, and your loved one is led away.
 - ... after the baby arrives, demanding more of you than you ever dreamed possible.
 - ... after you find a pink slip with your final paycheck.
 - ... after your family and friends have heard your story
 one too many times, but you still need to
 talk it out.

Stephen Ministers are the After People. They are ready to come alongside you—or your friends, neighbors, coworkers, or relatives—and provide comfort and support for as long after as needed.

First of all, we are in the midst of our stewardship drive. We invite you to prayerfully consider how you might increase your level of giving. On October 21st, we will celebrate Consecration Sunday. (You probably have received or will receive more information about this through the mail.) There will be only one service that day at 10 a.m. Rev. Rachel Cornwell will be our quest preacher. Afterwards, we will meet for a luncheon in the fellowship hall downstairs. The stewardship team reminds us that stewardship is more than just focusing on money by itself. Stewardship is also allowing God to use us as instruments in the way we use our time, talents, and presence.

Secondly, I ask that you keep our Youth Ministry in your prayers. We are indeed blessed to have such a lively, active youth group that is supported by caring, committed youth counselors. As your pastor, I have listened to the parents of the youth, their concerns, hopes, and dreams for this important ministry.

Thirdly, we have communicated with you at various times about what is happening at the higher levels of the United Methodist Church. (Please read the article found in this edition of the Pointer submitted by Rev. Dunnington and myself.) This gives us a brief summary of the process on The Way Forward. You are provided as well with the names of various sites on the web that allow you to learn more about this on your own.

In conclusion, we are certainly experiencing powerful winds of change. During the Day of Pentecost that is described in the book of Acts, chapter 2, we are told that God's Spirit descended upon the early disciples as a mighty rushing wind (some translations say a 'violent wind'). From that time onward, the winds of God's Spirit brought to the disciples both changes and challenges. I would imagine the powerful winds of God's Spirit may have seemed rather frightening to the disciples at times, just like they might seem to us. Yet they forged ahead putting their trust and hope in God's grace. I came across this quote by Elizabeth Kubler-Ross: "Should you shield the canyons from the windstorms, you would never see the beauty of their carvings."

As I said at the beginning of my letter to you, I am blessed to serve such a faithful congregation here at Mt. Zion. God's Spirit is still doing creative work in us. I will continue to keep each of you in my prayers as we serve in the name of Jesus Christ.
