LRCA General Membership Meeting Minutes LaSalle-Backus Education Campus November 7, 2016

President Rogers called the meeting to order at 7:10 pm. Pastor Meg Jenista, Washington, DC Christian Reformed Church, provided the invocation.

Mr. Jimmy Rock, Deputy Director, Office of Consumer Protection, Office of the Attorney General, provided information about scams now being perpetrated on consumers. Be cognizant of the fact that the IRS will not call a citizen on the phone as a first contact method. When you receive a political donation solicitation, ask for the phone no. and website for the candidate before considering making any donation. Never give out any personal information, especially Social Security numbers, to anyone calling on the phone. It is very difficult for authorities to stop people from attempting scams, but citizens can take precautions to protect themselves.

Thomas Talamonte reminded attendees that Advisory Referendum B, "Advisory Referendum on the State of New Columbia Admission Act Resolution of 2016," is on the ballot for a vote on Election Day, November 8, 2016. The referendum directed the D.C. Council to petition Congress to enact a statehood admission act to admit the State of New Columbia to the Union.

Below are candidates for office in the District of Columbia who presented at the meeting:

Candidates for State Board of Education-

- 1. Lynette Woodruff (Ward 4)- Focus will be on making certain schools and families are on the same page.
- 2. Mary Lord (At-Large)- All students will receive education in science and engineering. Financial literacy and cursive writing will be reintroduced to students.
- 3. **Tony Donaldson, Jr.** (Ward 7)- Wants to make certain that students graduation on time with college or life skills readiness.
- 4. **Ashley Carter** (At-Large)- Focus will be raising graduation rate to meet the national average within 4 years, adding more individualized attention in classrooms and preparing students for college or career.

ANC Candidates-


- 1. ANC 4B07- James Gaston, III will focus on public safety, traffic, senior citizens and the operation of group homes that are located in the neighborhood.
- 2. ANC 4B09- LaRoya Huff will listen to all residents in the neighborhood and respond. She will follow-up and follow-through.
