Recent Teaching/Learning Audit

As many of you know, we had a County Teaching and Learning audit recently (similar to, and, in fact, harder, than an Ofsted Inspection). There were many good points listed as strengths including:

- There have been some notable recent successes. Phonics skills have improved significantly in the last two years and in 2017 all Year 1 pupils reached the expected standard for their age. The school should be congratulated on this achievement.
- Pupils behave well most of the time and are keen to learn. They are polite and courteous and get on well together. In lessons, pupils generally try hard and do their best.
- The school successfully promotes pupils' good social and emotional well-being. It does this through its calm atmosphere and its nurturing environment where problems are tackled quickly.
- Pupils participate well in assemblies, for example, contributing successfully to a discussion about sporting achievements and healthy lifestyles.
- The curriculum is enriched well by practical activities, visits and visitors

We have a range of key issues to address and are currently drawing up an action plan to tackle these.
