

## Impact of Sports funding 2016-2017

- School games Kitemark award. Docking & Brancaster Gold, Sedgeford Bronze.
- Docking 2<sup>nd</sup> place in the Bepak Grand East Anglia Run Schools Challenge winning £500 (previous year 3<sup>rd</sup> place)
- First year Brancaster entered into the 'Girls ' Football event at Lynnsport (Year 3/4)
- 2<sup>nd</sup> year running that Docking Year 3/4 'girls' went through to the finals of the Football event and became Championship Winners.
- Opportunities locally; Millennium Centre (team building), Cooking demonstrations & local walks.
- Docking often fielding 2 teams in cluster events and on occasions Brancaster & Sedgeford are able to field a team or combine teams.
- Docking KS1 children progressed to the finals of the School Sports Partnership Tri-golf event at KES after being crowned winners at Heacham Primary.
- Offering differing clubs open to all Federation children.
- Establishment of cluster Sports Council & election of reps. Voice of pupils to suggest new sports, competitions and sports awards.
- Links to outside clubs increased: Karate, Badminton (waiting list for Docking Club) additional clubs in King's Lynn, Dersingham & Bircham Cricket Clubs, Football clubs KS1 & KS2, Tennis in Brancaster & Heacham, Sea Eagles Swimming club & Learn to swim sessions at Oasis and Bircham CITB.
- J Easter received Real PE training offering a different approach to PE. Written into PE policy.
- Road to Rio gave children the opportunity to try out different sports such as; Handball & Archery. Norwich City WOW sessions concentrated on food groups combined with games enabling the children to identify sugars or carbs for example on food packaging.
- Swimming- 100% of Year 6 children from both Docking & Sedgeford were able to swim a minimum of 25 metres competently, confidently and proficiently. Brancaster 92%. We have benefited from a strong swim team teaching, been able to provide spare kit if needed and have strong links with swimming clubs available as Hannah Ayers teaches at Oasis and Jacqui Easter teaches at CITB.
