Note from the Head

I hope that everyone had a fabulous break last week – what glorious weather we are having! Ideal for getting out and about and having fun in the sun.

I shall be leaving at Easter to resume my role as Deputy Head at South Wootton Junior School. I have enjoyed my time as Head of the Federation and would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your support and I would like to wish all the children all the very best for the future.

On behalf the Governors I am pleased to confirm we have found an experienced head, Ms Paula Jones to lead us through the summer term. Ms Jones will be in some days during this half term to ensure a smooth transition.

Keeping your children safe online

We take every opportunity to talk to the children about keeping themselves safe, what to do if they see or hear something which concerns them online, reminding them about recommended ages for playing games such as Fortnite and using social media apps such as Facebook and Snapchat. We talk about internet safety in class discussions and PHSE lessons, in ICT lessons and in whole school assemblies. The Friday before half term was National Internet Safety Day, and the children participated in activities around keeping themselves safe online.

It is vital that parents are aware of the risks of their children being online and keep yourselves informed about how to protect your children. We try to help with this as much as possible. Current trends which school are particularly worried about are Momo – in which children are sent a scary face through Whatsapp and asked to add a contact; Tik Tok where children post videos of themselves dancing or performing to music – but has been used as a platform for grooming and music can be very sexually explicit or inappropriate; and Fortnite the online game where children are messaging each other and have sent or received inappropriate messages and images. These are very real safeguarding concerns. Please find links on the next page which you may find helpful.
