Clifford Smith Wrigley Jr's Legacy

Clifford Wrigley was determined that his legacy of research into the origins of the towns of North Andover and Andover be continued and shared. In his will, he bequeathed a portion of his estate to the North Andover Historical Society, Andover Historical Society, and Lawrence History Center:

I specifically direct that the above-named societies use the bequest above for further research into my discoveries into my discoveries of the (hitherto unresearched) primary events of our history:

- (a) Our first, 1629 settlement;
- (b) Our second, 1634 settlement; and
- (c) Gov. Winthrop's involvement with the first, 1629 settlement and the third 1642 settlement; and
- (d) The publication of the results of this further research

As outlined in his will, this website publishes Wrigley's research as presented in his original format in two slide presentations (1991 and 1993). Also included is the further research conducted by Carol Majahad and Inga Larsen of the North Andover Historical Society.
