Registered name: Utopian Lil Bit of Majic

Age: Magic will be 8 on November 20.

About a name: Magic's name is a combination of his father's kennel name, Utopian, and Ellen's first Papillon, Lil Bit. When Ellen registered him with AKC, they misspelled his name with a 'j' instead of a 'g'. Ellen thought it was cute and kept the misspelling.

Sports/venues: Magic competes in several agility venues, including AKC, CPE, and TDAA. He also competes in AKC obedience.


Congratulations to the following:

- New Champion! Lauren Gomez's Dancer (pictured) earned her C-ATCH at the Pawsitive Action CPE trial.
- Maren Baldwin's CleverGirl earned six qualifying scores, all with 1st placements, at the Paws & Ques CPE trial and completed all the Level 1 titles.
- MaryAnn Campbell's Summer earned her AKC Rally Intermediate title with a 2nd placement and a score of 98 points out of 100.
- Sally Treat's Charley earned his AKC Trick Dog Novice title.
- Jan Schultz's Faith earned her Novice FAST Preferred title in AKC agility.
- At the Pasco Paws CPE trial, Maren Baldwin's Hart had two perfect days in Level C, qualifying in five runs. At the Paws & Ques trial, he qualified in five runs and nailed all but one of his weave entrances.
- At the Pasco Paws CPE trial, Sally Treat's Ty earned a personal best of 41 points in Full House.
- Diane Gailit's Skylar qualified in nine out of ten runs at the Pasco Paws CPE trial, earning seven 1st placements, two 2nd placements, and one 3rd placement.

- Lisa Chavez's Ebony qualified in seven runs at the Paws & Ques CPE trial, with six 1st placements and one 2nd placement.





- Vicki Drerup's HiJinks earned his AKC Beginner Novice obedience and Rally Novice titles in St. Louis at the 2018 Golden Retriever National.
- Carolyn Rothfusz and Jax (pictured) competed in NADAC Championships in Gillette, Wyoming. In the pre-championships trial, Jax ran in five runs, winning 1st place on four runs and 2nd place on one. In Championships, he made it to the finals round. Out of eight runs, he placed 4th three times, 6th twice, 7th once, and 10th twice. He finished in 4th place out of all U.S. and Canada dogs competing and 6th place overall in the world competition, which included the U.S., Canada, and Australia.



- Barbara Layton's Josi earned her CD in AKC obedience with a score of 197 out of 200.
- Ron Brooks and Xe hiked the 100-mile Wilderness of the Appalachian Trail in Maine.
 Starting in Monson and ending in Millinocket at the base of Katadin Mountain. Skills like a-frame, dog walk, jumps, double jumps, and teeter were essential to complete this hike in 6.5 days without injury and off lead the entire 100 miles.

Training Tip

Each time you run, try to focus on one behavior, such as a perfect start-line stay, your contact criteria, or well-timed connections with your dog. Allowing yourself to focus on one specific behavior enables you to easily see your successes as well as the places that need improvement.
