


When Learning a New Language

President Emeritus of the Museum of Modern Art, Agnes Gund, penned an article for the Huffington Post in 2010 titled *"Relish the Art That Surrounds You"*. It was a good piece, where she notes, *"We are surrounded by art and beauty - all of us, wherever we live, wherever we do. Our challenge is to recognize and relish it."*¹. A

Ski's describes the inspiration behind his series titled "**City**": *"Of all the places that I've lived I've never felt more at home than when I lived in New York City. However much it has changed it still feels like home. My urban landscapes attempt to reflect that. I normally forgo the frenetic aspects of the city in favor of the more quiet scenes. This is by and large what New Yorkers tend to do, look for solitude in a city of eight million people."*



The epitome of bureaucracy in of all its glorious dysfunction. Nowhere else in the world do we encounter so many perfect examples of a nation's economic policy decisions, both successful and failed. Experience a trek filled with mile after mile of rust, rot and decay, and if you pay close enough attention, you won't even notice that you made it to your destination more or less on time. Witness the patchwork of repairs that were given absolutely no aesthetic consideration, but are beautiful nonetheless. The rails, where form follows function, if you are lucky. It is the one place on the globe where you are constantly reminded that no one gives a crap about what you see out your window. Welcome, to America's backyard.”*


A well-credentialed artist, Ski credits much of his recent success to the practice of daily painting. He describes its profound effect on his work and life:

"This practice was brought to my attention by a well-meaning student and friend, Treva Ghattas. She thought that it might be a good way for me to make a living through painting. She showed me examples of the work of Carol Marine. I was duly impressed, but I could not see myself doing this. The paintings were so small and my work was much, much larger (daily paintings are in the five by seven, or six by six inch range. At the time, I was creating works that were seven by six FEET). I researched it further and found the works of Michael Naples, Julian Merrow-Smith, and the father of daily painting Duane Keiser (he is credited with coining the phrase, "painting-a-day").

What put me over the edge in deciding to try it was a conversation I had with Stephen Magsig at an exhibit opening. Seeing his incredible work and hearing his passion for the discipline, convinced me to try it.

After several false starts and more disastrous paintings than I would like to admit (this is not as easy as it may look), I was ready to take the full plunge. Not just the painting part but the selling as well. As it turned out my procrastination paid off. It gave Carol Marine and her husband, David time to build a site solely for selling these paintings. As Carol puts it, "Imagine if Ebay and Etsy had a kid, who was an artist." I have been a member of Daily Paintworks since August of 2012 with absolutely no regrets.

Although I no longer produce a painting each day, the principles of working each day has stuck with me. The paint on my palette is never dry, and I am constantly running out of painting panels. All is right with the world."




