ESCAPE VELOCITY

There is nothing fun about being stuck. But the worst kind of stuck, I think, is being stuck in the past. Most of the choices I made before I was a Christian, and many of the ones I made after, harmed me, the ones I love, and my Savior. But when I start to feel down about those things, when I struggle to let my past go, I am reminded of one of my favorite stories from Acts 9:1-9, which tells the story of Saul’s conversion.

Saul had no use for Christians, that's for sure. And he didn't just *think* about how much he hated them, either. He *did* something about it. So, Paul had a fearsome reputation among those belonging to the Way. Imagine, then, how he must have felt when he discovered that all the hurt he had caused had hurt the very One Saul sought to honor. The zealous energy Saul expended to harm those who followed Jesus, the Son of God, harmed God. That was some past for Saul to let go of. But as Saul learned, the good news is that the gospel lets us let go.

The gospel lets us let go because, if left to our own devices, we would never have the velocity we need to escape our past. When we get stuck on our past, it stops us where we, preventing us from growing, stands in our way, preventing us letting go, and strips us of our joy, laying us low.

The gospel rescues us from being “stuck” because it lets us let go. Saul could have been wracked by guilt for the things he had done to those who follow Christ. He could have held onto that hurt, paralyzed by his own choices. But that isn't good news, and Jesus brought good news to Saul. Instead Jesus chose Saul, destroyer of the faith, and by the power of the Holy Spirit he became Paul, defender of the faith as the gospel let him let go.

It doesn't matter if what we are struggling with happened twenty years ago or twenty minutes ago. The past cannot hold us back. It does not have that power. The resurrection power of the Holy Spirit has been ignited in us. We can defy gravity and reach escape velocity through the power of the gospel of Jesus Christ, by which we have been saved.

Today, let the Lord transform you, trusting that He who began a good work in you will perfect it until the day of Christ Jesus. It is not your destiny to be defined by your past. It is your destiny to be formed by the future as the Spirit helps you abide in Christ and bear much fruit. That is Father's will for you in Christ Jesus, so that you may approve the things that are excellent. That is the good news for us this morning: the gospel lets us let go, providing us with escape velocity, so that we can move from defeated, to dangerous. Amen.
