OOA Marks Milestone

The OOA celebrated its 115th anniversary, December 31, 2013, and will be marking the historic occasion with a

year-long statewide radio advertising program, complemented by internet digital ads and an online promotional video.

Specifically, the campaign includes 60and 30-second radio commercials aired throughout the state; targeted digital banners statewide to reach 150,000 Ohioans who are seeking health information on the internet; and an ondemand video about the OOA posted on a special "Associations Advance Ohio" landing page.



The radio spots are produced by Ohio News Network (ONN) and will be aired on its affiliated stations. ONN includes 70+ radio stations around the state and reaches Ohioans in all 88 counties. The ads will air Monday through Friday, 6 am-7 pm, and Saturday, 6 am-12 noon, which is considered prime time for radio listening.

Several other associations are participating in the "Associations Advance Ohio" campaign. Listeners who hear any of the ads sponsored by participating associations -- including the OOA, Ohio Dental Association and the Ohio Veterinary Medicine Association -- are directed to a common website. That page (currently under renovation) contains videos about each association along with a link to their websites and online professional directories. The collaborative advertising program, which emphasizes choosing a professional who is a member of his or her state association, works synergistically by having a common tag line and website.

AOA Hosts DO Day in DC

More than 1,200 DOs, osteopathic medical students, and other representatives of the profession—including 94 from Ohio—gathered in Washington, DC, March 6, 2014, for the annual DO Day on Capitol Hill. The OOA provided bus transportation for 58 students from Ohio University Heritage College of Osteopathic Medicine (OU-HCOM).

OU-HCOM sponsored a reception the evening before Hill visits so Ohioans could network with the state's Congressional delegation. Reps. Steve Stivers (R-Columbus), Marcia Fudge (D-Cleveland) and Brad Wenstrup (R-Cincinnati) all stopped by to answer questions and talk with participants. Agenda topics for the visits included permanent repeal of the Sustainable Growth Rate formula

for Medicare Physician Reimbursement as well as continued funding for Teaching Health Center Graduate Medical Education (THCGME), which makes it possible to train primary care residents in community-based health care settings.

DO Day is the preeminent opportunity for DOs, students, and friends of the profession to lobby members of Congress and their staff face-to-face. •
