Greetings to Members and Friends of The Brooke!

Another summer has passed and another school year is ahead of us. Where did the summer go? I, for one, love buying school supplies with my kids every year and I can't resist buying something for myself every time. I remember the days when we had to follow the list that the school provided so that we knew exactly what to buy: 16-count crayons - check; 24 pencils - check; 6 folders with pockets - check.

Since all my children have moved on to college, however, we are no longer supplied with such lists. At first, it's a little frightening to not have a list to check off items with. My kids have to actually "guesstimate" the school supplies they will need for the WHOLE year. Sometimes, it's hard to predict whether or not you'll need 3 or 4 extra packages of loose-leaf paper. More often than not, however, things have worked out so that their school supply lasts the whole year.

Where are you in your stage of Christian life? Have you "graduated" from middle school and are now in your high school years in terms of faith formation? Or are you in your college years or in your graduate school years? It doesn't matter how old you are chronologically, what matters is how old you are in terms of your faith. Expectations from those whose faith are in the "college" or "graduate" stages should be higher than those whose faith is still in the "middle school years." And if you are in the "middle school" years, what steps are you taking to ensure that you graduate and will be moving on to your "high school years?" It sometimes is easier to be handed a "list" of what we should do every year. But like all things in life, we need to be moving on and be constantly growing.

Stagnancy is not an option for Christians. We come to a point when we no longer need a "list" because we are led by the Holy Spirit instead. We trust that the Holy Spirit will tell us what we'll need, what needs to be done, and where we're going. That's why it is so comforting to know that we are not alone in this life journey. Let's walk together, hand in hand.

September 3 – Thirteenth Sunday After Pentecost

Readings: Exodus 3:1-15 and Matthew 16:21-28

The scripture focus is Exodus 3:2 “There the angel of the LORD appeared to him in a flame of fire out of a bush; he looked, and the bush was blazing, yet it was not consumed.”

The title of the sermon will be: “Fire”

It had been forty years since Moses had killed an Egyptian overseer who had treated some of his people particularly harshly. It has been forty years since Moses' exile into the wilderness of Midian where he sought refuge with the local priest's family and married his daughter to escape prosecution and possible execution. That was a lifetime ago. Surely there were still some memories, some wonderings about what was happening there. But the memories were faded. The wonderings were few and far between. Until that fire. That mysterious fire. That fascinating, tremor-inducing fire. That holy fire. That fire from which the Holy One continued to speak. Moses may have left his former life behind him, but the Holy One did not.

September 10 – Fourteenth Sunday After Pentecost

Readings: Exodus 12:1-14 and Matthew 18:15-20

The scripture focus is Exodus 12:14 “This day shall be a day of remembrance for you. You shall celebrate it as a festival to the LORD; throughout your generations you shall observe it as a perpetual ordinance.”

The title of the sermon will be: “Passover”

Death may seem a very odd place to celebrate creation. However, death has accompanied all life on earth since the time of the first and smallest of creatures. The instructions for the Passover celebration addresses death head on. The Passover lamb will die. The body of the lamb is handled in a very specific way so that its death functions as a channel of life, strength, and protection in the face of a profoundly deadly plague about to encompass humans and animals alike where they are held captive. Let's discuss how death, in its variety of forms, is both life-giving and destructive where we are.

September 17 – Fifteenth Sunday After Pentecost

Readings: Exodus 14:19-31 and Matthew 18:21-35

The scripture focus is Exodus 14:21 “Then Moses stretched out his hand over the sea.

The LORD drove the sea back by a strong east wind all night, and turned the sea into dry land; and the waters were divided.”

The title of the sermon will be: “Sky, Wind, and Sea”

Through a pillar of cloud by day and a pillar of fire in the sky by night, God leads a newly-freed people out of harm's way and toward a new homeland. Through a "strong East wind" God creates a path through the sea for the people to walk on, then lets the sea close in on a pursuing Egyptian army. In this way, sky, wind, and sea all became channels of deliverance for these people.

September 24 – Sixteenth Sunday After Pentecost

Readings: Exodus 16:1-15 and Matthew 20:1-16

The scripture focus is Exodus 16:8 – “The people quarreled with Moses, and said, ‘Give us water to drink.’ Moses said to them, ‘Why do you quarrel with me? Why do you test the LORD?’”

The title of the sermon will be: “Water”

The scripture reading from Exodus focuses particularly on our need (and the need of all living things) for water and God's gracious provision of it. In the story from Exodus, there is reason to be concerned. The people were in a wilderness, a desert, far from any visible water source. They would, in fact, die if they could not obtain water soon. They had not exhausted any wells or streams, nor polluted any to make them undrinkable. They had simply followed Moses (and God) to a place where there simply was no water to be had as far as they eye could see. Safe supplies of water remain a significant concern globally. Unsafe water spreads disease and death. How does our community relate to water supplies? How do our congregation model trust in God to provide and, at the same time, wise stewardship of the gift of water so not only us, but all living creatures, may be blessed by it?
