It says so much about a church and your love for God and one another that through times of transition, you faithfully keep moving forward, participating in meal programs, singing in choir, preparing for Vacation Bible School, working diligently in committees, and showing up for the many other ministries you participate in, all the while praising God for the opportunities we have to be of service.

As we get to know one another, I'm eager to learn about how God is calling each of you individually and The Brooke as a community to be part of the world-changing project that we call Christianity. We'll be exploring our callings together in the month of June with the sermon series, "Incoming Call: Answering the Unknown Numbers." When I worked my first job at Waukegan Harbor, we didn't have caller ID and the front desk staff had to answer every call the same way: introducing ourselves and asking how we could help the caller. As we look at four stories of God calling people and communities in scripture, we'll ask what it would mean for us to respond confidently to the calls on our own lives, knowing who we are and being brave enough to ask God how we can help – even when the call might be to something totally different than we've imagined.

On June 3rd, we'll celebrate communion and study the call story of Samuel, where he learns that nobody figures out a calling by themselves. On June 10th, we'll read Luke's account of Jesus calling the first disciples and ask just how big a deal it was that Jesus chose fishermen instead of scholars to be teachers and preachers. On June 17th, we'll spend some time thinking about the United Methodist mission statement and our collective calling to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world, in the context of Micah 6:1-8 and Matthew 22:36-40. Finally, we'll conclude the series on June 24th with the call story of Jeremiah, asking what God says about ageism – the type of discrimination experienced by both younger folks and older folks – learning how God's expectations of us are wildly different than society's expectations.

We have so much to learn about one another and so much that I know we will accomplish together, and I can't wait to get started! I've been praying for all of you, as you've celebrated the ministry of Pastor Nancy and her family, as you've done so much work to prepare for Kyle and me to come, and for all of those moving pieces in your own lives that don't stop when change happens at church. My prayer for each of you is that you know how deeply you are loved – by God, by your family at The Brooke, and by me. Please pray for me too, that God would use me to serve the church and our community so that all people will know that love!
