



### Ephesians 1:3-4

Praise be to God who has blessed us in the heavenly realms with every spiritual blessing in Christ. For **HE** chose us in Him **BEFORE** the creation of the world to be holy and blameless in His sight.

### What will you be remembered for?

Martin Luther is remembered for starting the Reformation of the Church (the Roman Catholic Church) in 1517 by nailing his 95 theses to the door of the All Saints' Catholic church. They were his objections to the corrupt practices occurring in the Middle Ages. This was 500 years ago, and next year in 2017 this “Reformation Jubilee” will be celebrated in Wittenberg, Germany. It is a big anniversary for Christians worldwide, and especially for Germans.



“Martin Luther, I think, is one of the greatest Germans in history,” says Margot Kässmann, a Lutheran theologian with the Evangelical Church in Germany. But looking back at Luther’s legacy also means acknowledging that Luther wrote and preached some vicious things about Jews and those comments were picked up centuries later by the Nazis, and used to influence people with anti-Semitic propaganda.

So, while we credit Martin Luther with making the Bible available to the ordinary person by translating it from Latin into German, and we are grateful for his emphasis on being “saved by Grace and not by works”, our admiration of this man is nevertheless soured because of his anti-Semitic statements. Perhaps it is good for us to reflect on what we would like to be remembered for after we have gone.
