October - December 2014

Thank you for your faithful prayers and support. So much has happened since my last report letter, so I'll just hit some of the highlights of the last three months.

October: October brought an end to my 2 ½ years in Vanuatu. One of my last outreaches was to the Island of Gaua up in the north part of Vanuatu. We were there for 7 days. Last time when Matt and Jeremy were there, they were stuck in a village, Dorik, waiting 3 days on a boat and as a result witnessed to the village in spite of them not wanting Matt and Jeremy there. This time, I joined them and hiked 12 hours to the village and crossed several rivers. We were supposed to find a church there. The chief had refused to allow a Baptist church, but the believers split the village and started a new village with a Baptist church right next door. After the trip, I only had a couple of days left in Vanuatu. Half of the congregation of Luganville Baptist Church came to say their goodbyes at the airport. Leaving Vanuatu and saying goodbye to my friends was one of the hardest things I had to do. After the goodbyes, I traveled to New Zealand to attend a couple of weddings of my close friends at the end of October.

November: After my time in New Zealand, I arrived back in USA on November 5th and was glad to see Jennivine Yu again and brought an end to our year long distance relationship. After a week of being back in Indiana, I had the opportunity to share my testimony and a short message in a youth rally of 100 teenagers held at my home church.

December: After much prayer and with both of the families' blessings, I proposed to Jennivine on Christmas day. We are planning on getting married the summer of 2015.
