There have been many meetings of the Executive Board of FMCA to discuss various ideas to improve the financial condition of FMCA, while continuing to be the excellent organization that it is. Much of the discussion centered upon saving money without eroding the quality of FMCA. Most of the suggestions will await approval by the Board of Directors at the Indianapolis Convention.

Many of these suggestions may not even be noticed by the average member. There will be cost cutting in the area of early arrival staff and volunteers. The budget for convention entertainment will be lowered, while efforts are made to keep the same quality that convention attendees have enjoyed.

It was announced that Hutchinson, Kansas, would be the site for the 2013 Convention, but from the information that I received, it appears that Gillette, WY, might be a more economical site. That also will be discussed in Indianapolis.

We would like to invite all of you to "Back Home in the Country". We are planning an old fashioned back to basics rally for you in Tipton, Indiana. The Tipton Fairgrounds will be the location of the pre-rally August 21 - 24, 2012. We hope many of you will be able to attend. Tipton is a small community located about 40 miles north of Indianapolis. We spend many weeks here during the year while visiting our daughter and her family. The people here are among the friendliest and most helpful we have come across while living this lifestyle.

We want you to come relax and let us treat you to some down home hospitality. We will have a catered breakfast each morning, no one needs to get the coffee going, just show up and eat. Our caterer will serve you scrambled eggs every day with pancakes and sausage; breakfast sandwiches; or biscuits and sausage gravy on rotating days. There will be fruit and oatmeal available each day as well as coffee and juice of course. On the day we caravan to the Convention, we will have a continental breakfast so you can take it with you if you desire.

When you arrive, we will have grills going with brats, burgers and all the fixings available for your afternoon meal. All meals other than breakfast will require you to bring your own beverage of choice; everything else will be provided for you. We will prepare three evening meals, one being a Rib Eye Steak, Baked Potato and Salad. Two other great meals are planned but you need to show up to find out. You will be on your own for lunch which will give you time to explore the area, play golf or just chill. We have some surprises along the way so we don't want to spill all the beans, you just need to be here and have fun with us.

There are many interesting places in the area to explore; we will have all the information so you will be able to pick and choose what you would like to do. If you wish to come in a few days early, just let us know. There will even be a Horse Show Saturday and Sunday for entertainment. Just keep in mind; we may put you to work.

Please bring extra water hoses if you can, as water is not available at each site, we can link hoses together to make sure everyone has water. In the event that we run out of 50amp services, the fairgrounds will allow us to use cheaters, so if you have one bring it also.
