While I don't have much to add to all that was passed along at our recent monthly SOS breakfast meeting that you will note in the minutes below, I did fail to pass along the word of a visit that our Chaplain and I had with a Veteran Marine that recently relocated back to Colorado Springs from Arizona. He and his family were in need of some assistance from our Marines Helping Marines Project Fund in the form of paying a \$350 deposit for Utilities to be turned on at a house that they were able to rent. He had just started a new job and would not be paid for two weeks, which put them past the landlord's deadline for the Marine to transfer responsibility for the utility bill into his name. After Chaplain Carty and I met with this young man and verified his form DD214, we were able to contact the utility company and make arrangements to pay the deposit plus \$150 to give them some credit towards their first utility bill as they head into the colder months. Hopefully by now they will have been able to get their belongings out of storage in AZ and moved up here as well.

condition than the one we currently own and within the budgeted amount that we had voted on several months ago. We will be scheduling a couple working parties very soon to transfer everything from the old trailer to the new one so we can safely transport all the toys to a warehouse location as soon as that is locked down. The old trailer will be used as static storage for those times when companies contact us to donate large shipments of toys during the off season months such as those that are currently in our 40' CONEX box that was donated to the detachment over the summer. Now if we could just get our hands on a building for the detachment to call it's own that could not only host our monthly meetings, but also be large enough to operate Toys for Tots out of, we wouldn't have to be the wandering nomads scrounging every year for donated space to operate out of. But that's a task for us to tackle later down the road.

The 29th annual High Country Toy Run is this coming Sunday (2OCT2016). It will start off from the new Walmart/Sam's Complex at 4425 Venitucci Blvd. (north of Pikes Peak Community College on South Academy near I25) and end with a HUGE after ride party and auction at Anchors Country Bar in the wonderful town of Fountain. We will have cash sales set up at the beginning of the ride as usual and will need Marines in Dress Blues to hand out official ride pins to all of the participants that bring a new/unwrapped toy.

I am also excited to inform you all that this year will be the first Teller County Toy Run on 9 Oct. Kick-stands up at 1100 in front of McGinty's in Divide and riding to Cripple Creek, CO. Our detachment will be occupied with our Bowl-a-thon that same day

I am currently negotiating all the final details for a potential site for the 2016 Toys for Tots Campaign which is bearing down us very quickly. No contracts have been signed as of yet so there is always potential for things to not work out, so, If you see a large vacant building in your travels around the city, please call me ASAP with the address and info on Real Estate Sign and we will follow up on it immediately. Move in day will be on top of us before we know it! Please shoot me a line if you are available to assist with this year's campaign. Whether it be in delivering boxes to drop site locations, sorting

and counting toys at the warehouse or by bringing snacks to the volunteers at the warehouse. It takes us all working together to make Christmas incredible for underprivileged boys and girls this year.
