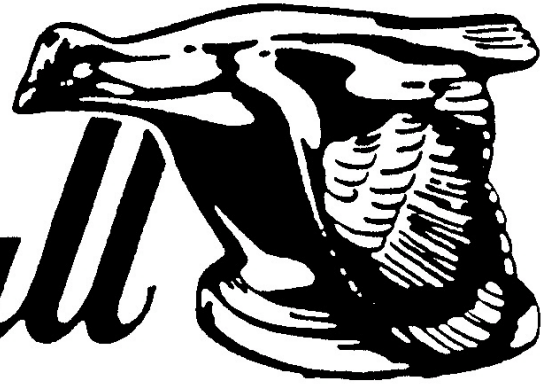

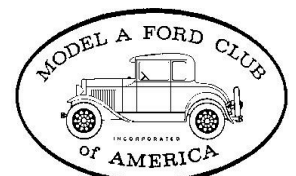

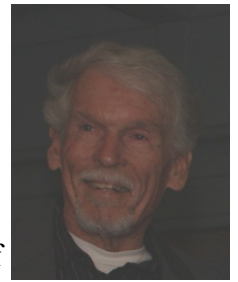

DIRECTOR'S REPORT: Bud Swartwood



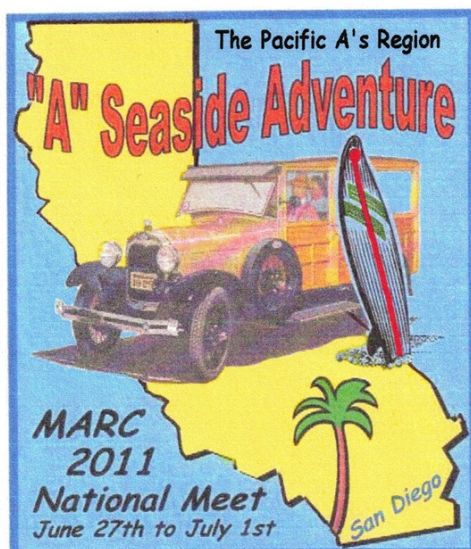

UPCOMING TOURS:

Our next tour is scheduled for Saturday, February 12, 2011 and we will head east to visit both the Pacific Southwest Railway Museum and the Motor Transport Museum in Campo. We will meet at the El Cajon Target parking lot (250 Broadway, El Cajon) and depart at 8:45 AM. There is an optional one-hour, 12-mile round trip train ride available, which departs from the Campo station at 11:00 AM. The train ride (The Golden State Excursion) travels to and from the International Border and is \$15 for adults, \$12 for Seniors (65+), and \$5 for children (6-12). The train fare includes admission to the museum, which is otherwise \$5. After visiting the railway museum, we will have a picnic lunch, so be sure to pack a lunch and bring your lawn chairs. After lunch we will travel a short distance to the Motor Transport Museum, which is located in the historic Campo Feldspar Mill. This museum features over 200 trucks, and numerous pieces of industrial and mining equipment on display. Admission to this museum is free, however they do accept donations. 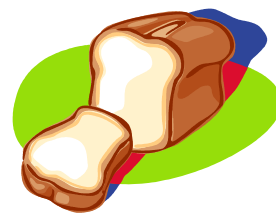

HELP NEEDED FOR THE MARC NATIONAL MEET— HOSPITALITY ROOM



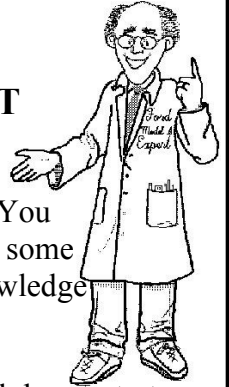

TECHNICAL SEMINARS AT 2011 MARC NATIONAL MEET

What a wonderful opportunity we will have this coming June to attend a National Meet right here in San Diego!!! Do make plans to attend as many different types of events as possible. You will learn so much and have a great time too. Don't miss attending the technical seminars as some of the most knowledgeable people in our Model A hobby have volunteered to share their knowledge with us. The following is a partial list of the seminars I highly recommend you attend.



Restoring Door Handles & Locks Yourself by Tim Wilson and Cal Allen. They will demonstrate how to do a basic locking door handle restoration that anyone can perform. They will describe the various types of locking handles manufactured for Model A's and which ones are easiest to restore and refurbish. Information on door handle lock cylinders and key cutting will also be presented

Model A Speedometers by Chris Cushman. He will discuss the history of the Model A speedometer and the different manufacturers. Present a power point presentation of his shop showing the different steps taken to restore Model A speedometers. Give tips and suggestions on how to maintain your speedometer. He is currently supplying rebuilt speedometers for most of the major Model A parts suppliers like Snyder's, Brattons etc. His rebuilt units are a work of art.

Ads, Literature and Posters by Howard Minners. Howard is a noted authority on Model A "paper". He has a collection of Model A ads published in magazines and newspapers throughout the world. Also, Ford posters and advertisements displayed at the Ford Dealerships. Attending this seminar will give you an insight into how Ford was able to promote the sale of the Model A vehicle.

Radios of the Model A Years by Barry Dagestino. He will discuss and show American Radios from the early 1920's to the early 1940's with emphasis on those produced from 1928-1931. His collection of over 2,500 antique radios is the largest west of the Mississippi.

Model A Woodgraining by Dave Garcia. This hands-on seminar focuses on faux wood graining finishes. During the session you will learn how to prepare your model A interior trims. You will learn how to use simple hardware products to obtain a look as close to the real thing as possible using color and wood graining techniques. To start off, Dave will show you how to achieve the best surface preparation and proper adhesion for your base coat. Techniques on how to brush and feather in the straight grain will also be demonstrated. He will discuss how to spray clear coats, color sand and polish. Also the use of equipment required to achieve the best, finished product will be discussed. Materials and equipment used will be displayed for viewing. The seminar will be easy to understand and you should leave with the feeling you can do your own woodgraining.

Shocks & Shock Arms-The Complete Story by Steve Schmauch. 500 pounds of shocks, arms, and links will be on display. This will be the most complete collection ever assembled. Steve's exhaustive research summarized in a multi-page handout will be available. Expert or novice, this presentation is guaranteed to shock you!

This is just a few of the top-notch experts who will share their expertise with us at the MARC National Meet. In our next Quail Call I will tell you about other technical seminars you will want to attend. **Keep in mind that you must be a member of MARC to attend the National Meet. 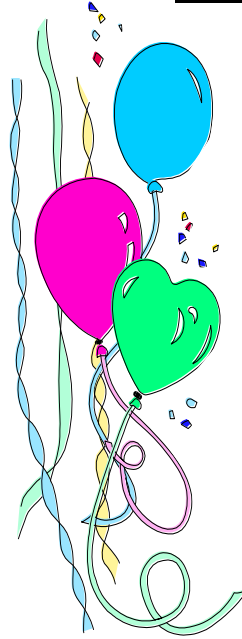

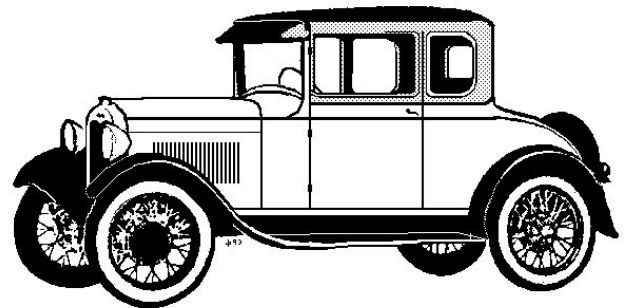

MAFCA 2011 National Tour

The **2011 MAFCA National Tour** will be held along the Natchez Trace Trail from **April 9-15, 2011**. Trail lies within the boundaries of the Natchez Trace Parkway, which extends 450 miles from Natchez, Mississippi, to Nashville, Tennessee.

The Parkway commemorates the historic Natchez Trace, an ancient path that began as a series of animal tracks and Native American trails. It was later used by early explorers, "Kaintuck" boatmen, post riders, and military men, including General Andrew Jackson after his victory at the Battle of New Orleans.

The Natchez Trace National Scenic Trail incorporates existing segments of the original Natchez Trace wherever possible.
