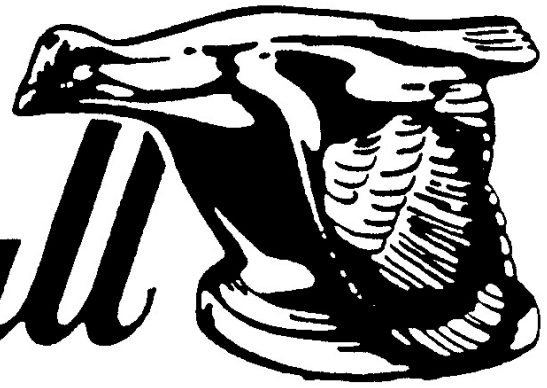

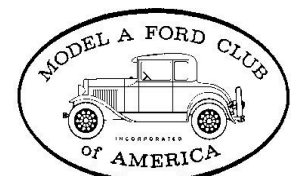

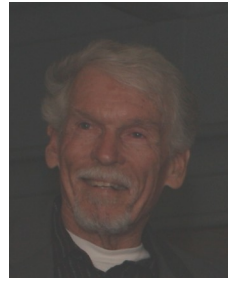

Dalene Jensen is already working on the Installation Banquet for this coming year. Contact **Dalene** if you are able to assist or have an idea to share.

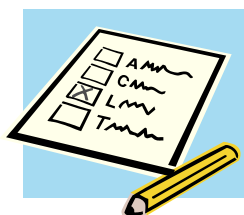

Ladies, many of you asked me to get the recipe for one of the cookies that we served at the MARC National meeting this summer. I have finally gotten that recipe so here it is..... Enjoy!

COCONUT—CRANBERRY CHEWS



Note: The mixture may look dry until it comes together as a dough. If it's too crumbly to form into balls, the dough needs to be mixed longer, it should be smooth, homogeneous mass.

Makes: about 6 dozen cookies

About 1 1/2 cups (3/4 lb.) Butter at room temperature
2 cups sugar
1 tablespoon grated orange peel
2 teaspoon vanilla
1 large egg
3 1/4 cups all purpose flour
1 teaspoon baking powder
1/4 teaspoon salt
1 1/2 cups dried cranberries or dried cherries
1 1/2 cups sweetened flaked dried coconut

1. In a large bowl, with a mixer on medium speed, beat 1/1/2 cup butter, sugar, orange peel and vanilla until smooth. Beat in egg until well blended.

2. In a medium bowl, mix flour, baking powder, and salt. Add to butter mixture, stir to mix, then beat on low speed until dough comes together, about 5 minutes (see note preceding). Mix in cranberries/cherries and coconut.
3. Shape dough into 1-inch balls and place about 2 inches apart on a buttered 12 by 15 inch baking sheet.
4. Bake in a 350 degree regular or convection oven until cookies edges just begin to brown. 11 to 15 minutes (shorter baking time will yield a chewier cookie, longer baking time will yield a crisper cookie). If baking two sheets at one in one oven, switch their position halfway through baking. Let cookies cool on sheet for 5 minutes, then use a wide spatula to transfer to racks to cool completely.

HEAD LAMP BULBS



The following is taken from the June 1931 Ford Service Bulletin.

NEW HIGH POWER HEAD LAMP BULBS

Offer Opportunity for Profit

Due to various State laws and regulations established many years ago, original installation of bulbs in head lamps and spot lamps have been limited to 21 candlepower.

State officials have recognized the need for unusually bright road illumination for high speed night driving and the regulations have been revised so that 32 candlepower head lamp bulbs are now authorized in 46 out of the 48 states. The only exceptions are Missouri and Nevada which still specify the 21 candlepower limit.

A remarkable improvement, 50% increase in head lamp or spot light illumination, can be obtained by owners who desire more light at low cost. This can be done by replacing the present 21 candlepower bulbs in both lamps with the new style 32 candlepower bulbs.

I find it interesting that during the Model A era States regulated head lamp bulbs. Today we can buy 50 candlepower bulbs for our headlights. This is another 60% increase over the old 32 candlepower bulbs. Most of us avoid driving at night but occasionally we find ourselves needing our head lamps. There are three things that contribute to good head lights: bulb size, condition of reflector plating, and bulb focus. Also, don't forget to rotate the 3rd brush in the generator to produce a higher generator output. The 3rd brush should be rotated in the direction of the armature rotation to increase the output.

While you are thinking about the head lamps, don't forget the rear tail lamps. The new LED bulbs, designed to fit the tail lamp, really help visibility from the rear. I strongly suggest you consider LED bulbs for your tail and stop lamps. They are not that expensive when compared to the damage a rear-end collision would cause.
