Perhaps someone on this street has an original Model A, in perfect condition, stuck away in a barn or garage?

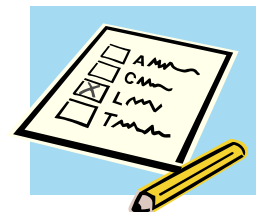

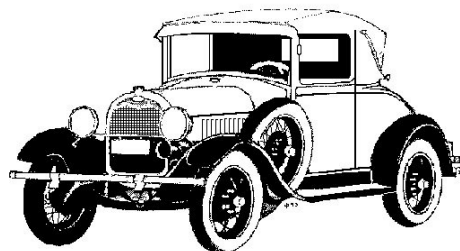
Historian - Patty Winchester asked members to send her interesting notes about life with a Model A to include in the scrapbook. She is continuing to work on the book.

Here are some key points to know about the show:

- A portion of every ticket sold using the online code on the flyer or directly through me by the car owners will benefit MADD.
- The winning car owners in a handful of categories including people's choice will be recognized on the field during a pregame ceremony.
- The car owner, club, or dealership who raises the most money for MADD (via tickets sold) will also have a representative on the field during the ceremony.
- Even if a car owner chooses not to stay for the whole game, they must stay until at least 2:05pm (or when SDPD says it's safe to move their car) as pedestrians will still be arriving after the game starts.
- There will be security watching the cars during the show and the game.

Thank you all for coming out to these events. And a special thank you to the Arbor's for supporting our club with a donation.



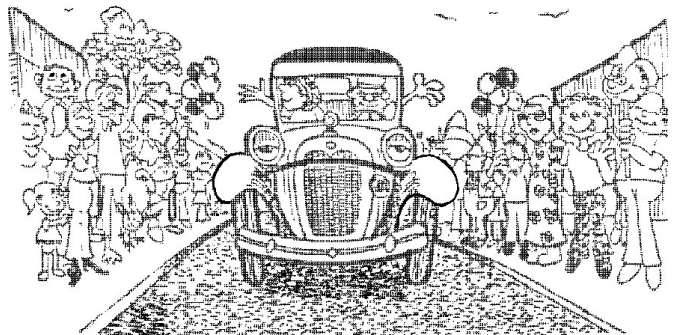

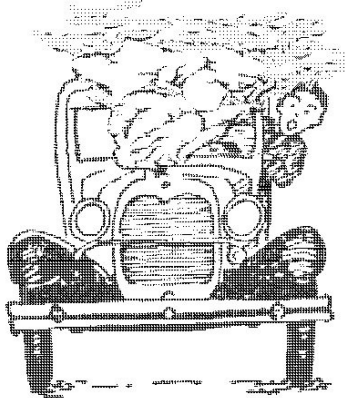

TECHNICAL TIPS.... Arlyn Bieber

ENGINE OVERHEATING??

My recent overheating problem prompted me to think about the reasons for an overheating engine. The following are some of the reasons for an overheating engine:



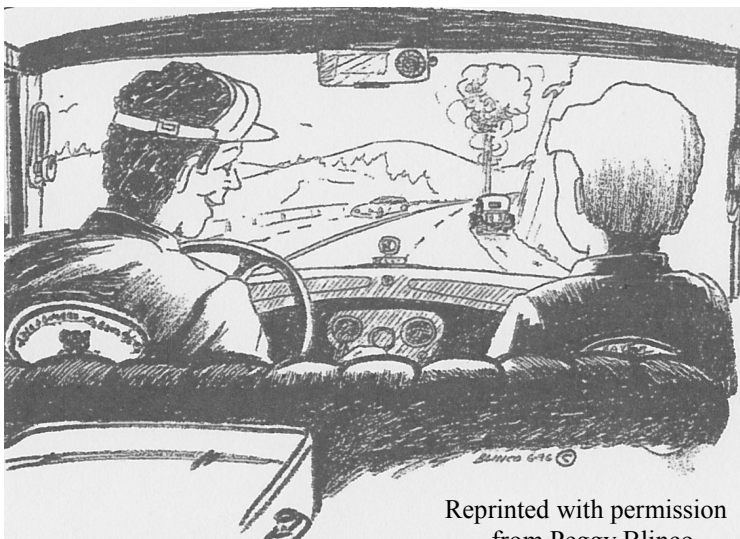
- Not enough water in radiator
- Leaky radiator hoses or water pump
- Radiator tubes clogged
- Too much paint on radiator
- The fins are loose and not making contact with the tubes
- License plate restricting the airflow
- Fan not original style and not pulling enough air.
- More than two blades on the fan do not mean the fan will pull more air!
- Baffle missing in upper tank
- Overflow pipe too short
- Engine block water passages filled with rust and dirt
- Engine not timed correctly

Some of the radiators manufactured years ago were cheaply made. If you have one of these early radiators you should replace it. These radiators are usually thin and very light weight when compared with the originals. Also, the '28 models used a "round tube radiator" which did not cool very well when new and won't cool in today's high-speed traffic.

Using distilled water is probably a good idea but even more important, always use an anti-rust solution in the cooling system.

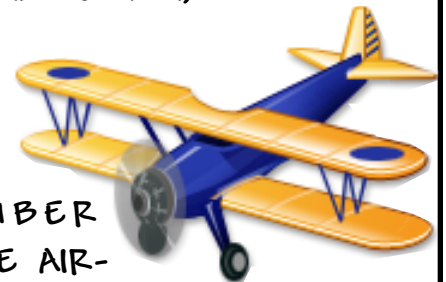

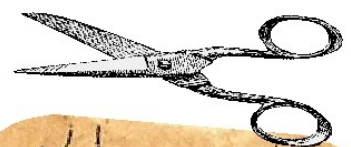

A REQUEST FROM HISTORIAN PATTY

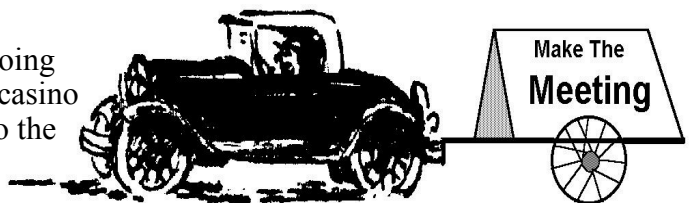

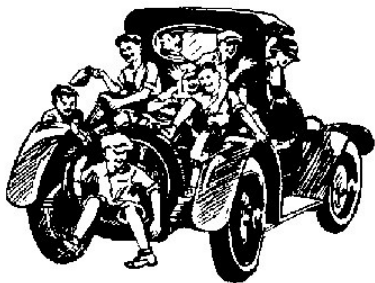

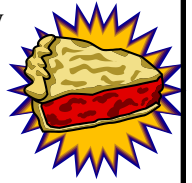
MEMBERSHIP BOOKLETS

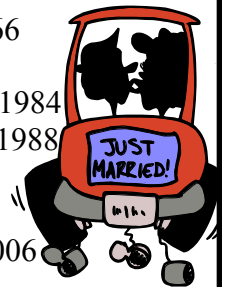
