


**Ect:** Nayola Bieber did some research with AAA and shared the different packages available for towing.

### Choke


For the next meeting, I'd like to discuss the finer points of Choke. Here's what I was able to find for the basics:

When the engine is cold, fuel vaporizes less readily and tends to condense on the walls of the intake manifold, starving the cylinders of fuel and making the engine difficult to start; thus, a *richer mixture* (more fuel to air) is required to start and run the engine until it warms up. A richer mixture is also easier to ignite.

And -

If not enough air is provided, the engine will run rich, often resulting in poor fuel economy and black smoke exiting the tail-pipe. If there is too much air mixed with the fuel, the engine runs lean, producing less power and more heat.

There are lots of resources on line including some great YouTube videos explaining carburetors and choke.


