

Spring PM's

It's Spring time in San Diego! Time to box up the heavy winter jackets, store the snow shovel and put the block heater back on the shelf. It's also time to get you're A's ready for Tour and Parade season.

MAFCA online has some great resources. If you don't already have a garage full of instruction books, there is a list on MAFCA of 31 books, guides and tips. https://www.mafca.com/ref_books.html

There is also a link to an index of the Ford Instruction Books that outline the changes from year to year. You can even see the French and Australian manuals.

The downloads page (https://www.mafca.com/ref_downloads.html) has an index of articles for how to restore your A (<https://www.mafca.com/downloads/Indexes/How2Index-all.pdf>). From another downloads page (<http://www.mafca.com/downloads/>) you can see a copy of the PM checks (http://www.mafca.com/downloads/Maintenance_Checklist.pdf) from the Model A Ford Mechanics Handbook by Les Andrews.

The checks are broken down into Every Fuel Stop, Monthly, 500 Miles and the like. For the next meeting, I plan on discussing with the Club best practices for those that are driving fewer miles in their A. Beyond the visual checks of the oil, water, engine and fan, there is changing the crankcase oil. The Handbook recommends every 500 miles but I would guess that this is because most are not daily drivers and drive less than 500 miles per year. I've not yet read through all of it, but the Rocky Mountain A Club has published an extensive article on oil and changes




Phrases from the Past (All In A Name)




