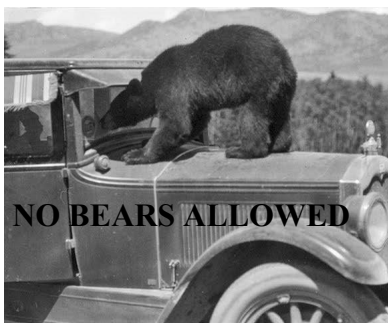

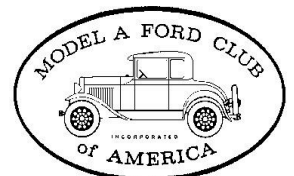

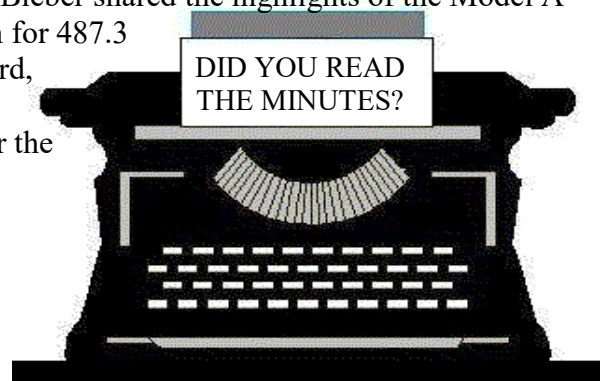

## TECHNICAL TALK – Ian E. Bowman

Let's follow through the evolution of one of the components of the A:



You probably already know that in 1896, at the age of 32, Henry built the Quadricycle ([https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Ford\\_Quadricycle](https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Ford_Quadricycle)), picture below. It used four bicycle tires, a two-cylinder engine, and a tiller to steer. At 4 horsepower and two gears, it could reach 20 MPH. Starting was straightforward using a flywheel (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=AYNge9r1Yi4>). Henry started the Henry Ford Company in 1901 but left and then it became the Cadillac Motor Company. Henry then started the Ford Motor Company in 1903 with \$28,000 from twelve investors including John and Horace Dodge – now familiar names in the auto world.



From 1908 to 1927 Ford produced 16.5 million Model T's. Since the T's were made from metal and wood, Henry used the scraps of wood to make charcoal. The location of the plant was changed and the land brokered by Henry's brother in law, E.G. Kingsford. Another familiar name, but this time in the BBQ world. Starting the T (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=OfQWnaWLDeQ>) used a hand crank and if you weren't careful, could backfire to cause injury. This happened with a friend of Cadillac CEO Henry Leland. Leland commissioned Charles Kettering, who created the Dayton Engineering Laboratories Company. Another now familiar name if you know the acronym – DELCO. The first car to have a starter was the 1912 Cadillac. By 1920, most cars had an electric starter. The first auto to have a key actuated starter was Chrysler in 1949. Now, push buttons in cars use a signal to the onboard computer to start the engine.
