




## **Editors Ramblings:** Valarie Basham



**Membership-Ed Woodruff:** There are 68 members in attendance. We welcome RJ Taylor who purchased Karen Whittkop's 1928 Coupe.





*"You shouldn't have to do this," the clerk told her. "It's the base commander's job to make sure that his troops have access to the forms they need."*



## Henry Ford 1863-1947

**T**he Ford Motor Company produced nearly five million Model A

Fords between 1927 and 1932. The father of the company, the man with the concept and the drive, was Henry Ford. He adapted assembly line technology to the automobile manufacturing process. With the resulting improved product quality, he lowered prices and shared profits with his workers. He introduced the \$5 per day pay standard when others were paying only one-half that amount. As a result, Ford workers stayed on the job and the quality and outflow improved even more while the workers enjoyed a better life. At one point in time, one-half of all cars on the roads of America were Model T Fords.



Slowly, Henry Ford realized the need for a replacement for the Model T. On May 26, 1927, Ford announced the end of Model T production and the intention to build a superior replacement—**The New Ford Car**. The Model A Ford was first available on December 2, 1927. By 1929, Ford had regained the top position in U.S. car sales. The versatility and durability of The New Ford car is proven by the many body styles and functions performed by that single design by the number of cars still on the road today, and by the number of enthusiasts who own and enjoy the Model A Ford.




Ford Model "A" Town Sedan Deluxe that could be a daily driver. It's a 98%-original survivor that comes with all the parts, including the original brakes (which were replaced with 1940 Ford hydraulics; a common swap). The hydraulic brakes only have 100 miles on them - the car has been driven locally, but not a lot. The ticker has 19,831 miles on it as of February 2017. Model A runs well, including electrical and gauges. The front-end has been rebuilt, so it drives in a straight line. The bodywork has been done but for the roof, which is partially rebuilt, and with all the wood in place. It has one or two small dings from "in-passing" garage moments, and one spot of surface rust. It's always been garaged. This Model A comes with a great pile of original documentation, including the original bill of sale, lots of original registration documents, manuals, and a few photos (with the negatives) of the original owner with the car in its home state of Massachusetts. What's it need? Mechanically, not much. It would probably be good to flush the fuel tank. The interior and roof need to be done, and the paint is old, and the tires are past their prime.




