



TECHNICAL TALK with Dave Francis

Be Prepared for Touring



Hello everyone. With the tour/parade/display season now upon us, and with some members now preparing their cars for the long trek to the MAFCA Convention in Reno later this month, I thought an appropriate topic for review in June would be the tour preparation information that is detailed on the MAFCA website. Their article contains a comprehensive listing of tools, parts and supplies that serve as a good checklist when preparing your car for a tour. I'm quite certain that the contents of this listing is based upon years of Model A service experience by their membership and in the perfect world, you'd just acquire every item on the list and call it done. However, if you are dealing with space limitations as many of us are, it may be necessary to pare the list down a bit. Being relatively new to the hobby, I find the information I receive from club members regarding their Model A service experiences to be invaluable in terms of trying to plan and assemble a reasonably complete road trip kit.

Based on my research, experience to date, as well as discussions with club members, I'll share a few of my thoughts on the subject. In terms of tool recommendations, assembling as complete a tool kit as possible is a must in my opinion. Beyond what is listed below you may want to consider adding a head lamp and a "quick point gap setter" (Snyder's P/N A-12198). The head lamp frees up your hands to focus on your task, and the gap setter tool eliminates the need to rotate the motor in order to set the point gap. Also, I'm a strong advocate of having an electrical circuit tester in your tool kit. I encountered a problem with our car (not the Model A) at an El Cajon Cruise Night, and having a circuit tester in the tool bag enabled me to quickly troubleshoot and correct the problem.

Although the recommendation in the MAFCA article lists a distributor and carburetor as items to consider for longer trips, I'm of the mind that having serviceable distributor and carburetor assemblies available for all situations is a good course of action. They really don't take up much room, and as some of the members have discussed with me, being disabled on the side of a busy road while trying to replace points and/or condenser on a hot engine is not an enjoyable experience. It is much better to just change out the complete distributor and get underway, and save the detailed distributor troubleshooting/repair work for a more controlled environment. The same philosophy is applicable to the carburetor. Detail distributor and carburetor parts are certainly important elements in your road trip parts kit, but again probably better installed in a controlled environment rather than in a situation where you have cars whizzing past 6 feet away at 60 + MPH.
