Pom Italian Eatery offers “Dine for Dollars” to support Yellowstone Wildlife Sanctuary

Red Lodge — 1 May 2018 — Mention “Dine for Dollars” when eating at Pom Italian Eatery on June 4th, and they’ll donate a portion of your lunch or dinner tab to Yellowstone Wildlife Sanctuary.

“Robert and I hope Dine for Dollars becomes a low cost and hassle-free way for local nonprofits and charitable organizations to not only fundraise, but friend-raise,” said Sarah Russell, co-owner of Pom Italian. “We donate 15% of all sales for the day from dine-in guests who mention the organization. The idea behind offering it for dine-in guests only is to create a community space for that organization to mix and mingle with their supporters and create an atmosphere of giving.”



The Yellowstone Wildlife Sanctuary, located at the north end of Red Lodge, is a nonprofit that is currently working on a variety of habitat expansions and improvements. The Sanctuary's funding comes primarily from memberships, donations, and grants.

Pom opened in May of last year at the north end of downtown and is in the process of moving into a larger facility at 224 South Broadway. They work with local ranchers and growers, using organic, local ingredients whenever possible to ensure a farm-to-table menu.

"This is an opportunity to have a great meal while supporting the animals at the Sanctuary," said Gary Robson, the Sanctuary's Education Director. "One of the great things about being in Red Lodge is the support that nonprofits get from the businesses in town, and we appreciate Pom including us in their giving.

The Yellowstone Wildlife Sanctuary is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization with the mission of providing lifelong sanctuary to non-releasable native wildlife while sharing a message of conservation and education. The Sanctuary is home to a wide variety of animals native to the greater Yellowstone ecosystem, ranging from carnivores (mountain lion, coyote, bobcat, fox, lynx) to large hooved mammals (bison, elk), smaller mammals (porcupine, raccoon), and birds (falcon, raven, owl, crow). The bears are some of the most popular residents. The Sanctuary is currently working on a large new wolf habitat and a new sandhill crane/vulture habitat.
